Annual Plan adopted

Our Annual Plan for the coming year has now been adopted. 92 submissions were received on the draft plan, covering a range of issues, such as transportation expenditure, land drainage, community halls and other topics.

This year's Annual Plan also includes \$1 million in increased expenditure on roading. The money will be used to continue to maintain roads to their current standard, as the level of funding the Council receives from the New Zealand Transport Agency has reduced. Submissions from the public indicated that people did not want the standard of roads in the district to decline. We will be looking at how it can continue to fund road maintenance work in future years with a reduced level of government subsidy.

As part of the Annual Plan, the Council also consulted on a proposal to liquidate Selwyn Investment Holdings Limited (SIHL). This proposal has now been approved by the Council, and will remove overhead costs previously associated with running the company and increase investment income.

The average rates increase for 2013/14 is 5.3% – down from 5.8% proposed in the Long Term Plan. Actual rate increases will vary, as they depend on the services ratepayers receive and the relative change in their property value following a revaluation across the district.

Mayor Kelvin Coe is thanking submitters who made submissions and attended a hearing. Staff will be writing to submitters to advise them of the response to their submission.

Watch out for other road users

Drivers should always be aware that there may be pedestrians, joggers, cyclists and horse riders out on our roads and roadsides, even in winter. Although a vehicle will be seen some distance away, particularly if headlights are on, it may not be as easy to see the other road users until they are really close.

It is recommended that cyclists, pedestrians and riders also do the best they can to be seen. Wearing bright clothing, reflective bands or a high-viz vest won't make you bullet proof, but it goes a long way to help the driver see you earlier. Be safe, be seen.

Drivers should take extra care passing and always ensure there is enough clear road ahead if you need to cross the centre of the road. Corners and intersections require extra care on the drivers' part. Remember, if they are on the same side of the road as you, it is your responsibility to wait behind until it is safe to pass.

Land Use Recovery Plan

Following consultation on the preliminary draft Land Use Recovery Plan, Environment Canterbury (ECan), working with strategic partners, has prepared the draft Land Use Recovery Plan.

The draft Land Use Recovery Plan sets a framework and provides delivery mechanisms to:

- rebuild existing communities
- develop new communities
- meet the land use needs of businesses
- rebuild and develop the infrastructure needed to support these activities
- take account of natural hazards and environmental constraints that may affect rebuilding and recovery

The draft Land Use Recovery Plan includes proposed amendments to Environment Canterbury's Regional Policy Statement and the Selwyn District Plan.

The Minister for Canterbury Earthquake Recovery can make changes, make no changes, or withdraw all or part of these amendments in the draft Land Use Recovery

The amendments may be implemented as fully operative provisions of those planning documents after the Minister makes a decision about the draft Land Use Recovery Plan and any comments received on it

The draft Plan can be viewed online at www.cera.govt.nz and at the Council Headquarters at 2 Norman Kirk Drive, Rolleston and at Selwyn libraries/ service centres.
