Update following Power Outages

Roads

All sealed roads are open. The following unsealed roads are either closed or having clearing taking place:

- Hunters Rd (Gales Rd to Parkins Rd)
- Cants Rd (south of Lower Lake Rd)
- Collets Rd (south of The Lake Rd)
- Watsons Rd (Bluff Rd to Dalethorpe Rd)
- Mill Rd (Watsons Rd to Dalethorpe Rd)
- Boultons Rd (east of Kimberley Rd)
- Homebush Rd (east of Kimberley Rd)
- Hoskyns Rd, Kirwee (Courtenay Rd to Ansons Rd)

Where trees have impacted a power line, these cannot be removed until cleared by Orion. Council contractors are also out removing trees from roadsides and this may take some days.

Motorists should still drive with care on Selwyn roads as debris may still be present and trees are on the side of roads. People should not approach downed power lines and should report these to Orion on 0800 363 9898.

Water Supplies

All water supplies are now operating. However, any further strong winds could affect power connections. As water supplies have limited water storage at the moment people are asked to conserve water currently.

Stockwater

Many stockwater races are blocked by trees and debris and it is likely to take some time for contractors to clear these. Farmers can help us to clear races by removing trees. A stockwater supply point for tanker filling has been established at Darfield next to the Sicon yard in Mathias Street.

Showering, obtaining water and recharging your phone

Burning


As property owners clean up from the winds you may see some fires around the district. If you are considering lighting a fire remember that you will need to stay with it at all times.

Do not burn when strong winds are blowing or forecast; make sure you have a large firebreak and have a water supply and fire fighting equipment available. Read the safe burning guidelines online at www.selwyn.govt.nz/fire. Fires are not allowed in residential areas without a resource consent from ECAN. If you see a fire, check whether it's a controlled burn before calling 111.

Other information

The Selwyn Aquatic Centre is currently closed. Greendale, Kirwee, Springs and Shands Road cemetaries are temporarily closed until further notice. Other Council facilities are open with normal hours. Rubbish and recycling collections are occurring as normal.

Look out for Election Papers

Local elections take place by postal voting. Delivery of voting documents for this year's local elections will take place from 20 to 25 September. Voting papers are required to be returned by 12 noon on Saturday, 12 October to be counted.

Special voting is available to electors:

- whose names do not appear on the Final Electoral Rolls, but who qualify as electors, i.e. the elector has enrolled after the closing of the Electoral Roll.
- who did not receive a voting document previously posted to them
- who spoil or damage a voting document previously posted to them.
- whose names are on the Unpublished Electoral Roll.

To cast a special vote you will need to visit either Darfield, Leeston or Lincoln libraries or the Council's Headquarters in Rolleston during normal opening hours.

TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE ZIG ZAG ROAD

Zig Zag Road (1.1km from the intersection with Rakaia Gorge Road (SH77) to 1.1km from the intersection with Coleridge Road) will be temporarily closed between the hours of 8am and 5.30pm on Sunday, 22 September, for the purpose of conducting an Autosport Club motorsport speed event.

During the road closure, traffic will be requested to detour along the nearest alternative route.

Temporarily Closed

Selwyn Aquatic Centre has been temporarily closed to the public following an outbreak of



cryptosporidium, a bug which causes severe stomach cramps and diarrhoea.

Nine cases of cryptosporidium have been confirmed in the Selwyn District in the last month. Nationally, 877 cryptosporidium cases were reported in New Zealand in 2012.

Dr Alistair Humphrey, Canterbury Medical Officer of Health, says Community and Public Health is in the process of interviewing all people with confirmed cryptosporidiosis in an attempt to identify a common source.

Dr Humphrey congratulated the Selwyn District Council for its decision to close the Aquatic Centre until more is known on the outbreak. "We don't yet know for sure how the disease is spreading, proactively closing the pool is the responsible thing to do."

Dr Humphrey says to reduce the risk of further spread it is essential for people who have diarrhoea to stay out of swimming pools for at least two weeks after their diarrhoea has finished.

The water in the pools in the centre will be removed from the pools, discarded and replaced with fresh water. Pool systems will also be repeatedly flushed to clear out traces of cryptosporidium. The pool will not be reopened until test results confirm the water is free from cryptosporidium. The pool may be closed for around two weeks.

Aquatic Centre staff will be contacting customers who have enrolled in the swim school programme about the closure.

The District Health Board and Selwyn Aquatic Centre will continue to work together on this issue.

Resource Consents @Selwyn

Because of their possible environmental effects, many activities need a resource consent from the Council.

You have the right to inspect the full consent application received by council at any Council Service Centre during normal office hours or view on the council website www.selwyn. govt.nz and make a submission supporting or opposing the proposal.

Any person may make a submission but a person, who is a trade competitor of the applicant, may do so only if that person is directly affected by an effect of the activity to which the application relates that

- (a) adversely affects the environment and
- (b) does not relate to trade competition or the effects of trade competition.
