## Selwyn Aquatic Centre Update

Selwyn Aquatic Centre is currently temporarily closed to the public. We closed the pools as there was a suspected link to several cryptosporidium cases reported in Selwyn which may have been brought into the pools by a member of the public. We have emptied the pools of water and are flushing the pipes to clean the system of cryptosporidium in case it is present.

We will be able to reopen the pools when we have a test result indicating the pools are free from cryptosporidium. In anticipation of a clear water test result, we are looking to re-open the facility this Friday, 27 September at 6am. If we receive clear test results we may reopen later this week. ## Fire safety in Selwyn

An open fire season is now in place in the rural areas of the plains in Selwyn District.

Some property owners may be burning trees and vegetation destroyed in the recent high winds. In non-residential areas, these fires are permitted but you must follow fire safety guidelines. If you are planning to light a fire:

- never do so in high winds or if high winds are forecast
- always have a water source on hand and fire fighting equipment
- have a fire break in place of at least 10 metres around the fire, and
- stay with the fire at all times and dial 111 if it gets out of control

There are a number of other conditions which must be met before fires can be lit – visit [Selwyn.govt.nz/fire](http://Selwyn.govt.nz/fire) to read these. Fires in residential areas are not permitted without a resource consent from Environment Canterbury.



If your dog was first registered after 30 June 2006 and is not a working dog, the law requires him or her to be microchipped. This free monthly service is available at the following places.

## Look out for Election Papers

Local elections take place by postal voting. Delivery of voting documents for this year's local elections will take place from 20 to 25 September. Voting papers are required to be returned by 12 noon on Saturday, 12 October to be counted. Please post your papers by 9 October to ensure they are received on time.

Special voting is available to electors:

- whose names do not appear on the Final Electoral Rolls, but who qualify as electors, i.e. the elector has enrolled after the closing of the Electoral Roll.
- who did not receive a voting document previously posted to them.
- who spoil or damage a voting document previously posted to them.
- whose names are on the Unpublished Electoral Roll.

To cast a special vote you will need to visit either the Council's Headquarters in Rolleston, or Darfield, Leeston or Lincoln libraries during normal opening hours.
