Return your voting papers so your vote counts

To have your say on who should represent you, remember to return your voting papers on time.

Voting closes at noon on Saturday 12 October, but you will need to post your voting papers by Wednesday 9 October to ensure they are received by Saturday.

If you don't post your voting documents by 9 October, they need to be dropped into the ballot boxes available at the Council's Rolleston Headquarters, or the Darfield, Leeston or Lincoln Library and Service Centres before 12 noon on Saturday 12 October.

If you have not received your voting papers you can still cast a special vote but you need to contact the Electoral Officer on 03 347 2800 or 03 318 8338 to do so, or visit the Council's Rolleston Headquarters, or the Darfield, Leeston or Lincoln Library and Service Centres during normal opening hours.

As part of the local elections, you can vote for candidates for the roles of Mayor, Councillors, Community Board and Canterbury District Health Board members.

In the Springs and Ellesmere wards the number of candidates for Councillors matches the number of vacancies so no elections for these roles will take place. The Selwyn Central Community Board and the Hawkins subdivision of the Malvern Community Board also have the same number of candidates as the number of vacancies so no election will take place for these roles.

Where no election for a Councillor or Community Board member takes place, people will still have the opportunity to vote for other representatives, like the roles of Mayor and Canterbury District Health Board members.

Information about voting is also available online at www.selwyn.govt.nz. You can also visit the Council website to see the election results. Provisional election results are expected to be available from mid-late afternoon of Saturday 12 October.

Shands Road Speed Limit Reduced

A reduced speed limit has been introduced on part of Shands Road and some of the intersections connecting with the road in order to improve the safety of this area for motorists and other road users.

A new 80 kilometre per hour speed limit applies on Shands Road from south of Trens Road to Sir James Wattie Drive north of Marshs Road. The same 80 kilometre per hour speed limit also applies on Trens Road, Blakes Road and Marshs Road to east and west of the intersections with Shands Road.

Intersection upgrades along Shands Road were undertaken by both the Selwyn District and Christchurch City Councils in 2003 and 2004. Further major roading and intersection improvements are planned as part of stage two of the Christchurch Southern Motorway project. Construction of stage two of the project is expected to start in 2015/16 by the New Zealand Transport Agency.
