West Melton Sports and Leisure Centre

Consultation is now open on a proposal to develop a new sports and leisure centre at West Melton. The existing community centre is 80 years old. It is not large enough for the community as the population of the West Melton area has been growing rapidly. The building would also require earthquake strengthening and is not fit for some types of activities.

The new multi-purpose facility would include an indoor sport court space, a public hall, a kitchen, meeting and office space, a play centre and plunket rooms, an indoor court, toilets, showers, a first aid and referee room, entrance, foyer and reception.

Two drop-in sessions are planned to be held at the Rugby Club Rooms at West Melton Reserve for people to look at the plans, make comments and share ideas.
