Boil water notices explained

The Council maintains 33 public water water and leave for 30 minutes. During boil supplies in Selwyn. When water may be water notices, employers should also make unsafe to drink in any of these supplies, a boil water notice is issued.

Boil water notices are often issued for rural water supplies throughout New Zealand. Some areas of other districts have permanent boil water notices. The quality of Council water supplies is regularly tested.

Precautionary boil water notices are typically issued when turbidity levels are high or when effective treatment cannot be guaranteed. Turbidity occurs when small particles of sediment (like silt) are present in the water. Turbidity levels can be high when heavy rainfall occurs.

The water supplies that have historically been affected by turbidity include Arthur's Pass, Castle Hill, Springfield, Sheffield, Malvern Hills and Hororata Acheron. These supplies are sourced from river supplies or from shallow galleries next to a river.

When turbidity levels are high, water treatment methods may not be effective. The notice is issued as the Council cannot quarantee that the water is safe to drink. Turbidity monitors are installed at water intakes and are monitored by Council contractors.

A **boil water notice** is issued when water monitoring tests detect E. coli or other microbiological indicators of contamination. Groundwater monitoring reports from ECAN indicate that e.coli can be a problem in some private and public water supplies drawn from shallow water sources in Canterbury. Water supplies drawn from deep water wells which supply the larger towns in Selwyn are unlikely to be affected by e.coli.

What do I do if a boil water notice is issued?

If a boil water notice or a precautionary boil water notice is in place, the Ministry of Health advises that people should boil or treat all water from taps before drinking, brushing teeth or using it in food preparation. In addition, water used to make ice should also be boiled before freezing

Bringing water to the boil is sufficient to kill all bugs - water does not require prolonged boiling. Water needs to be boiled even if the smell or taste of chlorine is present. If water cannot be boiled, treat it by adding 1 teaspoon of household bleach per 10 litres of

sure their staff are only consuming boiled or bottled water at work.

You should continue to boil your water until you are notified that the notice is lifted. It is likely to be in place for several days. Anyone who shows symptoms of sickness should visit their doctor as soon as they are able to.

What improvements to water supplies are planned?

The Council has undertaken investigations and commissioned reports on options to improve water treatment for those communities who do not have a secure deep well water source. The results of this investigation will be used to inform consultation with communities about the options that are recommended in the reports.

Many rural water supplies have a small number of households on the supply. The cost of making improvements to water supplies is an issue which will need to be considered and consulted on.

Further improvements to monitoring systems and sensors are also planned in the future, for example through the installation of sensors which detect if chlorine levels in a water supply drop too low when water is being treated.

The Council is taking a more cautious approach towards water quality issues and is more likely to issue a boil water notice than in the past. This approach means that people should not expect that boil water notices will be issued less often in the future, even though the water quality monitoring systems the Council has in place are continually improving.
