Baleage doesn't belong on the Roadside

Farmers – please note that baleage cannot be stored along roadsides. For safety reasons, roadsides need to be kept clear. Baleage may only be stored along the roadside with permission of the Council and requests will only be considered if there is good reason why it cannot be stored on private land and it is not a danger to traffic.

It is an offence under the Traffic and Parking Bylaw to store baleage on road verges without first obtaining approval from the Council, and this can result in a fine of up to \$1,500. Please contact Joanne Harkerss on 347 2800 if you need further information.

Proposed Road Stopping

Council has received a request from Central Plains Water Limited for consent to the proposed stopping of part of an unformed legal road contained in SO 3155 and forming part of the Rakaia riverbed so that it can be incorporated into and form part of the construction, intake and canal site for the Central Plains Water Enhancement Scheme.

The request is pursuant to Section 116 of the Public Works Act 1981. If approved by the Council, the road stopping will be confirmed formally by the Minister in due course. Under the Public Works Act 1981 the consent of the Territorial Authority is required where the road proposed to be stopped is under its control.

Further details of the proposed road stopping can be inspected at the Councils Headquarters at 2 Norman Kirk Drive Rolleston.

Anyone opposing the road stopping should submit a written objection to the Council no later than 4pm on 20 December 2013. It should be posted to:

RESOURCE MANAGEMENT ACT 1991

Because of their possible environmental effects, many activities need a resource consent from the Council.


