Temporary Closure of Rolleston Library for Renovation

Rolleston Library will be closed temporarily from Monday 1 December to allow the library interior to be renovated to create more space for reading, research, events and new books. The library will reopen on Monday 15 December.

While the closure occurs, the Mobile Library will be making regular visits to the Rolleston Community Centre car park to enable people to check out books. A timetable of visits for each week is published on this page under 'Bookmarks.' A full timetable showing Rolleston visits is available online at www.selwynlibrary.co.nz. Rolleston residents can also visit other Selwyn Libraries at Lincoln, Darfield or Leeston. Library books can be returned to the returns slot at Rolleston Library.

Online library services will continue to be available 24/7 during the temporary library closure – visit www.selwynlibrary.co.nz. While the library is closed temporarily, the rest of the Rolleston Community Centre will be open with normal hours.

We are looking forward to reopening on 15 December and providing more space for reading, research, and library events and being able to display a wider range of books.

Fire restrictions and burning

A restricted fire season is in effect in Selwyn district and only gas barbeques, crop residue and rubbish fires inside contained drums are allowed in rural areas of Selwyn. There are a number of conditions which must be met before fires can be lit – see selwyn.govt.nz/fire.

In residential areas the only type of fire permitted throughout the year is a gas barbeque. Any other fires need a resource consent from Environment Canterbury.

We are currently receiving a large number of requests for fire permits. Our rural fire staff are currently very busy processing these requests and are prioritising these. If requests are not urgent it is likely to take some time to process the application.

If you are planning to apply for a fire permit please consider first whether you need to burn soon or can delay burning until fire restrictions are lifted. Tree branches can be disposed of for a charge at the Rolleston Resource Recovery Park on Burnham School Road. The park is open from 9am – 4.30pm Monday – Friday and 10am – 4pm on Saturday and Sunday.

Pest Control in cemeteries

Council contractors will be undertaking annual rabbit control laying Pindone pellet bait in Council cemeteries. Pindone is commonly used for rat and rabbit pest control.

The bait is bright green in appearance and will be laid by a licensed operator. Rabbits can damage graves and gardens in cemeteries. The rabbit control will occur over the next two weeks and cemeteries where the bait is laid will have signage at the entrance.

We would like to remind people that dogs are only permitted within cemeteries when on a leash. Dog owners should supervise their dogs to ensure they do not eat any pellets.
