
Have your say on how rural residential development is managed

SELWYN CENTRAL COMMUNITY BOARD NEWS

Rolleston Railway Station

The Selwyn Central Community Board is gearing up for the revival of the railway station as a community incentive/project. The go ahead has been given from KiwiRail noting that the building will have seismic testing work beginning in 6 months.

The goal is to have gardens and open up the building as a tourism spot providing toilets and using the waiting room for interpretation panels.

The Chair is currently putting together a project plan including strategies for a long term plan, planting, partnerships, development and tourism for that area. She is to present a draft at the next meeting.

Selwyn Bus Service

The Board received an updated from ECAN who are reviewing the bus service within Selwyn. They are identifying areas which need to be recognised as a route. Once this process has been completed ECAN will be presenting to at the Council.

Lincoln Library

The Board were updated on progress on the new Lincoln Library which will open in early February and will have more space for book displays, reading and hosting events.

West Melton Water

The board received an update on progress to improve water pressure for West Melton from Council staff.

The main pool at the Aquatic Centre has been retiled and is once again open to the public, along

with the other pools at the centre.

Aquafitness classes are also running on our normal timetable again.

Selwyn Libraries run book discussion groups for adults. The groups meet once a month and read a different genre of book each month.
