Are you eligible for a Rates Rebate?

If your gross household income to 31 March 2013 was around \$23,870 or less and you pay the rates on the property you live at, you may qualify for a rates rebate.

If your income exceeds this amount you could still be entitled to a rebate depending on the total cost of your rates and the number of dependents you have.

You can check out the rates rebate calculator and example tables on the Department of Internal Affairs website www.ratesrebates.govt.nz or contact the Council on 03 327 2800 or 03 318 8338 for more information.

You will need to provide your gross income to 31 March 2013.

Rates rebate applications for the current rating year can be accepted until 30 June 2014.

Temporary Use of a Family Flat

Pursuant to Section 7 of the Canterbury Earthquake (Resource Management Act Permitted Activities) Order 2011

TEMPORARY USE OF FAMILY FLATS by persons not related to the occupiers of the main dwelling on the site is a permitted activity in any living or rural zone identified on the planning maps of the Selwyn District Plan.

Allowing the use of family flats by persons not related to the occupiers of the main dwelling on the site will assist in providing additional housing following the 2010 and 2011 Canterbury earthquakes.

Activities operating under this Notice shall, pursuant to Section 7 of the above Order, at all times comply with the following standards:

- 1. The family flat is no greater than 70m² (excluding any garage).
- 2. At least one off street car park is to be available for the use of the occupiers of the flat.
- 3. The use of the family flat must revert back to housing immediate family members only on or before the expiry of the Canterbury Earthquake (Resource Management Act Permitted Activities) Order 2011.
- 4. That any person intending to utilise the provisions of this notice notifies Selwyn District Council's planning department in writing prior to occupying the family flat.

Lifting of Fire Restrictions in Malvern, Ellesmere and Springs Wards

Notice is hereby given that the previously advertised Restricted Fire Season, which extended over the Plains area of the Selwyn District, is lifted in the Ellesmere Ward, Springs Ward and Malvern Ward only (with the exception of the hill and high country areas which are permanently in a restricted fire season), as from 7am on Thursday 13 March 2014.

A restricted fire season is still in place in the Selwyn Central ward and only crop residue, fires in enclosed drums, gas fuelled barbeques and other fires if a fire permit has been issued are permitted in that ward, provided safe burning guidelines issued by the Council are followed.

Fires may now be lit in the open air without a Fire Permit in the rural areas of Ellesmere Ward, Springs Ward and Malvern Ward only (with the exception of the hill and high country areas which are permanently in a restricted fire season). Restrictions may be re-imposed at a later date if changed weather conditions create a potentially dangerous fire situation.

All residents are requested to take care when lighting open fires in wards where this is permitted and are reminded that legal liability for costs associated in fighting an uncontrolled fire lie with the person lighting the fire.

Before lighting an open fire, due attention must be given to weather conditions, adequacy of firebreaks, and the patrolling of fires until completely out, and it is requested that fires not be lit after dark.

Ward maps are available on the Council's website – www.selwyn. govt.nz/fire.

Notes:

- 1.A permanent Restricted Fire Season remains in place for the Hill and High Country of the District.
- 2. Property owners are reminded that for the Department of Conservation Estate and Fire Control Areas, fire control measures are in place all year and that organisation should be contacted for a Fire Permit prior to any burning.
- 3. No fires may be lit in residential areas without a Resource Consent from Environmental Canterbury.
