Hot off the Press and into your living room

Selwyn residents can keep up to date with **Top reads on Press Display:** international and local news through Selwyn Libraries' free online news service.

Press Display is a newsstand-like database that acts as an online library for news publications across the world. People can read over 2,000 up to date newspapers and magazines from around the world in 54 languages.

You can use the database to read popular newspapers including The Sydney Morning Herald, The Press and The New York Times.

On the online database you can view back issues for up to 90 days after the newspaper is published and you can search by the name of publication, country or keyword.

Access to the database is freely available on the public access computers in each Selwyn library branch, or to library members from home via the library website, www. selwynlibrary.co.nz under the 'online' link.

You will need your library card number and pin to access the service. Your pin is normally the last four numbers of your library membership number unless you have changed this. If you need help to use the service, please contact your nearest library.

Many trees were damaged during the wind storm in September last year. Most trees have now been cleared from properties and roadsides, but in some cases trees may still be left on roadsides. Roadsides need to be kept clear. Having trees or other objects on the roadside can be dangerous as it can limit visibility and leave no safe space for vehicles to park or pull over on if necessary.

Council contractors have also responded to a small number of calls where tree stumps have been dumped on the roadside and have had to be removed. Dumping trees or other rubbish is illegal and if you see it occurring please report this to the Council including the site of the dumping and, if known, the vehicle registration number.

Please help us to keep our roadsides clear by removing any tree debris in this area. Trees which have been blown over can be used for firewood. In the rural areas of Selwyn on the plains, fire restrictions have been lifted, so these trees can also be burned provided safe burning guidelines are followed.

These guidelines require that if you are planning to light a fire, you should:

- never do so in high winds or if high winds are forecast
- always have a water source on hand to put out the fire
- is out by dark have a 10 metre fire break in place around

light the fire during daytime and ensure it

• stay with the fire at all times and dial 111 if it gets out of control

The Malvern Community Board meeting was held at the Hororata Hall on 24 February 2014.

Members of local community committees were invited to attend and speak on local issues. The monthly meeting held in Hororata gave the Board the opportunity to meet with a number of localised committees in that area to gain a first hand understanding of issues in the local community. It was a successful meeting and further meetings are planned throughout the Malvern Ward during 2014.

The Darfield Medical Centre car park issues were also discussed at the Malvern Community Board meeting. The Board is looking at remedial works to rectify the car parking issues. The official Darfield Medical Centre opening was held on 7 March 2014.

The Board engaged in discussion with the local community committees regarding the Welcome signs for Hororata and look forward to discussing it further with local community groups.

The Board also spent a considerable amount of time giving consideration to items for inclusion in Council's 2014/15 draft Annual Plan. The priority attached to each of these items and the processes of engagement with local committees about the draft Annual Plan was also discussed.
