West Melton Sports & Leisure Centre

The Council has identified the need for a new multi-purpose facility within West Melton that would provide for the future sporting, cultural and community needs of the township and surrounding catchment. The current facility no longer meets the needs of the community.

A working party was set up by Council to progress the development of a new facility, made up of representatives from the Hall Committee, Reserve Committee, Residents Association and Selwyn Central Community Board.

The Council commissioned a facility feasibility study and indicative layout plan looking at a proposed location, the facility requirements and basic spatial layout. Consultation on preliminary plans was undertaken during October and November last year.

Survey findings

As part of the consultation a survey was carried out seeking comments on the layout and whether people would use the facility. The survey indicated there was a good level of support for the facility and that it will be well used if built. From the 195 surveys returned:

- 81% showed support for proposal
- 70% would use a facility
- 82% of survey participants were prepared to contribute towards funding

Some really good written comments were received on how the design could be further improved. This feedback will be considered as the conceptual design is developed.

A number of submissions raised concerns over the safety of access to the site. The Project Working Party acknowledges these concerns and although the location of the facility cannot change, the group will look at how access can be improved.

\$29,000 has been budgeted for this financial year to develop a feasibility and funding plan and to progress conceptual plans for the facility at West Melton Reserve. The project group will report back to Council on the findings of community consultation and work on a funding plan for the detailed design and construction phases of the project. Further consultation on this project will be undertaken as part of the 2015 Long Term Plan process in April 2015.

Sister City Trip

Selwyn residents have the chance to experience Japan as applications to travel to Selwyn's Japanese Sister Cities are now open.

Every second year, the Malvern Community Board, along with the Selwyn District Council, organise a trip for Selwyn residents or people who work in the district to visit its Sister Cities Yubetsu and Akitakata in Japan.

Participants need to pay for their own travel expenses, travel insurance and spending money, but free accommodation is provided through home stays and accommodation organised by Sister Cities.

Akitakata/Yubetsu 2014 Trip Information

- Both the adult and school group leave New Zealand in late September and spend five to six days in Akitakata in home stays and Council accommodation.
- Visits include Hiroshima Peace Park, Akitakata Council and local farms producing rice, soya beans and nashi pears. There will also be a visit to local schools including Takamiya Junior High School, which sends students to visit Selwyn.
- Travel to Tokyo on the bullet train and fly to Yubetsu. Visitors will spend four nights in Yubetsu in homestays and visit scallop farms, dairy farms, the ice museum, Council headquarters and other tourist sites
- Afterwards, fly back to Tokyo where the adult group may join the Darfield High School group to explore Tokyo – including Disneyland. Participants will need to arrange their own accommodation in Tokyo. Others may choose to return to New Zealand or travel elsewhere before returning home.

Applicants should ideally work or live in Selwyn, be fit to travel and be at least 18 years of age at the time of travel. An information evening is likely to be held after Easter. Expressions of interest should be sent to Bernadette.ryan@selwyn.govt.nz.
