Kirwee Water Supply Update

The Kirwee water supply is currently being chlorinated as the reservoir needs to be inspected and repaired. So that the repairs can happen, temporary water tanks to supply the township have been installed and will start operating from this week. The tank water will be drawn from the same water source as the main supply and will be chlorinated and safe to drink.

The water supply will continue to be supplied from temporary tanks until the reservoir has been inspected and is able to be used again. The Kirwee reservoir will be left full as a backup this week. The reservoir is expected to be emptied on Monday 14 April and inspected by an engineer. Repairs will be completed following this, but could take some time, depending on the works required.

The Council will be sending a letter to Kirwee residents letting them know when chlorination has stopped. The tank supply replenishes less quickly than the reservoir. So, while the tank supply is used, Kirwee residents are being asked to limit garden and lawn watering to help conserve water.

Visit China

Applications are being invited from people living or working in Selwyn for the 2014 Gansu International Fellowship Programme.

The programme allows a Selwyn resident to visit the city of Lanzhou in the Gansu Province of China to learn Chinese, and improve their knowledge of Chinese culture and business. Travel and accommodation costs are covered by the host city.

The fellowship recipient will also have the opportunity to visit Gansu's major facilities and tourist attractions. Shandan in Gansu Province is a sister city of Selwyn District.

Applications from people with a wide range of backgrounds will be considered – including business, farming, academic and from students. Applicants should be over 22 and under 50 years of age, in good health and be willing to present information about Selwyn District.

We're now consulting on our draft Annual Plan for 2014/15. You can find out more about the draft Annual Plan by reading the feature in today's paper.

Full copies and summaries of the draft Annual Plan are now available from our service centres, libraries and the Selwyn Aquatic Centre or on our website www.selwyn.govt.nz.

Guided by the outcomes (goals) set by the community, the plan sets out:

- a programme of services and activities to help achieve the outcomes
- the performance targets for the services and activities
- how much we estimate the services and activities will cost
- how much we estimate ratepayers will need to pay.

Please have a read and if you have any comments to make, write them down and send them to us. Written submissions on the draft Annual Plan can be made from Tuesday 8 April until 5pm Friday 9 May 2014. You can make a submission:

Hearings will be held on 29 and 30 May. Please say in your submission whether or not you wish to come to a hearing and talk to the councillors about your submission. Following the hearings, the Council will discuss the ideas submitted and then make final changes to the budget, which will then be adopted and

become operational on 1 July 2014. Council officers will be attending some local committee meetings to talk about the draft Annual Plan – see the Local Committees and Associations section of this page for upcoming meetings. Any additional meetings will be notified in future editions of Council Call.

Proposed amendments to the Council's Long Term Plan 2012/22 and Development Contributions Policy

The Council is proposing to amend its Revenue and Financing Policy to allow for the introduction of a \$60 (including GST) transportation targeted rate from 1 July 2014.

We are also proposing to change the way the Eastern Selwyn Sewerage Scheme is funded. This will reduce the Development Contribution charge paid by land developers and require some funding from existing connected ratepayers. This will not require a rate increase above what was already planned.



Citizen's Advice Agency

With increasing numbers of new residents moving into the Selwyn District, the need for information and advice on legal rights and referrals to services has grown.

This initiative will be open mid-year at the Darfield Service Centre initially one day a week. There will be an official launch one month prior to opening.

The Malvern Community Board has been asked to work with the Council to host the launch. More information to come.

AA services in Rolleston

Don't forget there's an AA agency at the Selwyn District Council offices, 2 Norman Kirk Dr. Rolleston.



You can renew your driver's licence, sit the driver licence theory test, register change of vehicle ownership or motor and

motor vehicle registrations, pay road user charges, get an international driving permit, pick up road codes and L-plates, get an AA membership, have your passport photographs taken and obtain an IRD number.

The AA agency is open from 8.30am to 5pm, Monday to Friday, except for public holidays.
