Sister City Trip

Selwyn residents have the chance to experience Japan as applications to travel to Selwyn's Japanese Sister Cities are now open.

Every second year, the Malvern Community Board, along with the Selwyn District Council, organise a trip for Selwyn residents or people who work in the district to visit its Sister Cities Yubetsu and Akitakata in Japan.

Participants need to pay for their own travel expenses, travel insurance and spending money, but free accommodation is provided through home stays and accommodation organised by

Akitakata/Yubetsu 2014 Trip Information

- Both the adult and school group leave New Zealand in late September and spend five to six days in Akitakata in home stays and Council accommodation.
- Visits include Hiroshima Peace Park, Akitakata Council and local farms producing rice, soya beans and nashi pears. There will also be a visit to local schools including Takamiya Junior High School, which sends students to visit Selwyn.
- Travel to Tokyo on the bullet train and fly to Yubetsu. Visitors will spend four nights in Yubetsu in homestays and visit scallop farms, dairy farms, the ice museum, Council headquarters and other tourist sites.




