Selwyn residents interested in finding out more about joining a sister city trip to Japan can come along to a meeting at 6pm Tuesday 20 May at the Darfield Library.

Participants need to pay for their own travel expenses, travel insurance and spending money, but free accommodation is provided through home stays and accommodation organised by Sister Cities. The adult group will also spend time with the Darfield High School student group who will be travelling in Japan at the same time.

Both the adult and school group leave New Zealand in late September and spend 5 to 6 days in Akitakata. Visits include Hiroshima Peace Park, Tokyo, and local farms producing rice, soya beans and nassi pears. Visitors will spend 4 nights in Yubetsu and visit scallop farms, dairy farms, the ice museum, and other tourist sites.
