Safe Burning

Firefighters have been called to a few fires in the Selwyn District recently where people have been burning after the hours of darkness or no one has been looking after the fire, or the fire has been lit in high winds.

Although we are in an open fire season on the plains, people are still required to comply with the council's burning guidelines, and could potentially be liable for costs if a fire escapes or needs to be extinguished.

It's critically important the fires are not lit in high winds, or when strong winds are forecast. Burning must only occur in daylight hours and the fire must be attended to at all times until completely out. The council's safe burning guidelines are:

- The piles to be burnt must be surrounded by a fire break of either a green strip or non-combustible material (bare earth, stones etc).
- The fire break should be a minimum of 3 metres wide or larger, depending on the size of the pile being burnt. Err on the side of caution.
- The piles to be burnt should be a minimum of 10 metres away from other trees and buildings
- Burning must only occur in daylight hours
- The piles being burnt must be attended to by someone at all times until completely out. Make sure all fires are out with no chance of re-ignition.
- Fires must not be lit when strong winds are blowing or forecast. Winds above 20 kilometres an hour are considered strong winds.
- Fires must not be lit or allowed to burn when smoke is likely to cause nuisance to neighbours. It is best to advise immediate neighbours that you are going to burn.
- Be careful that smoke does not drift across roads as you may be held liable for any crashes that result.
- Have some form of firefighting equipment on hand such as a water source or beaters. If a fire escapes immediately dial 111.

These guidelines apply only to burning in rural areas. Fires in urban areas are governed by Environment Canterbury rules.


The Faringdon Sensational Selwyn Awards recognise outstanding Selwyn businesses, community groups and individuals for their inspirational work and achievements.
