Public Notice by the Minister of Education

Partially Operative Selwyn District Plan

Section 173, Resource Management Act 1991

Under section 172 of the Resource Management Act 1991, Selwyn District Council has received a decision from the Minister of Education on the Notice of Requirement for the Rolleston High School.

The decision is to designate approximately 6.6 hectares of land in Rolleston between Goulds Road and Springston Rolleston Road, immediately north of the Aquatic Centre for educational purposes.

The decision on the Notice of Requirement may be inspected during opening hours at any of the Council's service centres or libraries.

Rights of appeal on this decision are outlined in Section 174 of the Act but are only available to the Council, submitters and the land owner. Appeals must be lodged with the Environment Court within 15 working days of this notice of decision.

New Fencing Guide Available

A new pamphlet and guide have been developed to help explain existing fencing rules in Selwyn to people considering building or adding fences.

People are able to choose their own fencing, but need to make sure the fence complies with District Plan requirements, which include rules about how and where fences can be established, depending on the location of the fence.

In Living Z areas, a residential zone in parts of Rolleston, Lincoln and Prebbleton and in the Lowes Road Outline Development Plan area in Rolleston, specific fencing rules are in place affecting the sides of properties facing either road or reserve boundaries. These rules allow for individual styles of fencing, depending on location and the intended purpose within certain parameters that affect the height and way fences are built, as stated in the District Plan.

"These rules are in place to help create attractive, safe neighbourhoods," says Gabi Wolfer, Urban Designer at Selwyn District Council.

"Fencing is more than just a physical barrier defining the edge of a property. Fencing is part of the street scene. If it is well designed, it can complement the environment and can help to make a neighbourhood into an attractive and a pleasant place to live and visit."

Gabi says that fencing also plays an important role in providing security both for people living in a section, and for adults and children using a footpath, road or reserve.

"The rules are designed to ensure that the parts of the property which border street corners or reserves are visible, which helps to reduce the risk of tagging and crime, while also improving sight lines for motorists and making it safer for people using public spaces nearby."

Property owners, builders and developers, who are looking at building fences in these areas, need to refer to the District Plan rules and the guide for advice on fencing. Copies of the guide and a shorter pamphlet summarising the guide are available online at www.selwyn.govt.nz and from Council libraries and service centre.

RESOURCE MANAGEMENT ACT 1991

Because of their possible environmental effects, many activities need a resource consent from the Council. You have the right to inspect the full consent application received by council at any Council Service Centre during normal office hours or view on the council website www.selwyn.govt.nz and make a submission supporting or opposing the proposal. Any person may make a submission but a person, who is a trade competitor of the applicant, may do so only if that person is directly affected by an effect of the activity to which the application relates that

- adversely affects the environment and
- does not relate to trade competition or the effects of trade competition.

Private Plan change 43

Synlait Milk Limited request the introduction of a new proposed Dairy Processing Management Area within the Rural Zone, 7km southwest of Dunsandel.

Synlait Milk Limited have lodged a private plan change application (Plan Change 43) that seeks to vary the Rural Zone rules specific to 113 hectares of rural land through the introduction of a proposed new Dairy Processing Management Area (DPMA).

The Plan Change amends existing policies and introduces a new policy and rules specifically providing for the processing, packaging and distribution of milk and dairy products. The site subject to the plan change request is located on the south side of Main South Road (SH1) approximately 7km southwest of Dunsandel and is located within the Outer Plains zone of the District in an area of predominately rural use. The site contains the existing Synlait milk processing plant, established under various resource consents.

The plan change and the assessment of why it is needed can be read at any of the Council's service centres and public libraries in Darfield, Leeston, Lincoln and Rolleston or online at www.selwyn.govt.nz.
