This must be in writing and in accordance with Form 6, which is available from any Council Service Centre or on our website. Stay safe on the roads this winter

In winter, driving conditions can be challenging. Daylight hours are shorter, temperatures are much colder and rain, fog and ice are common. Snow can also occur at times. All of these conditions contribute to making our roads more difficult to drive on and require that motorists take extra care. Wet, slippery roads can be unforgiving of even small mistakes, particularly on bends.

Winter driving does not have to be dangerous or intimidating. Preparing your vehicle and adjusting your driving for the conditions helps to ensure you can drive safely in the winter.



Driving in the wet

Key tip: Stopping distances nearly double on wet roads

Therefore, drivers should:

- slow down and keep a generous following distance between you and the car in front
- the two-second rule should be a four-second rule
- be extra vigilant – take corners slowly
- watch for road signs warning of flooding and remember that you will need more time to stop and avoid hazards in wet conditions.

Driving in the snow and ice

Key tip: Go slow on ice and snow

Whenever possible, avoid driving in heavy snow. If you cannot avoid it, when driving on snow and ice then slow down, and:

- allow for much greater braking distances
- avoid braking suddenly
- to avoid skidding, give the brake pedal a few taps rather than one hard push
- remember to carry chains and put them on when necessary.

Driving in fog

Key tip: In fog, turn on your headlights, not your park lights

You should also:

- adjust your speed to the visibility levels
- keep your headlamps on low (dip) beam, as high beam will reflect off fog and produce glare, further reducing visibility
- only use fog lamps when visibility is severely reduced (e.g. by snow or fog). It is illegal to use fog lamps in clear conditions at any time as they can dazzle other road users
- keep a generous following distance between you and the car in front.

Driving with sun strike

Key tip: Keep your windscreen clean, inside and out

Sun strike can occur at any time, but is most likely during sunrise or sunset during the winter months, when the sun's rays hit your windscreen at a low angle. This can make it difficult, or even impossible, to see. This is a very dangerous condition to drive in.

Driving on winding roads

Key tip: Reduce speeds on bends and keep left

Drive slower than you normally would – it only takes a split second to lose control in wet or icy conditions. Avoid sudden braking or turning movements that could cause you to skid. Accelerate smoothly and brake gently and use your highest gear travelling uphill and your lowest gear travelling downhill.
