### Public notice of summary of submissions and call for further submissions

Due to an administrative error an original submission on Plan Change 39 was not recorded as having been received by the Council. ## Council to look at options for improving safety

The Council is currently working with both Rolleston and Clearview Schools to look at options to improve safety for children getting to and from school.

Previously the Council has encouraged the schools to look at operating walking school buses and supervised school crossings with patrols. Supervised crossings are operated in many areas across New Zealand and provide a safe crossing point for children.

A study was also carried out to look into installing a zebra crossing on Rolleston Drive for children crossing over to Rolleston School. The report did not recommend that a zebra crossing be installed as it could potentially be less safe than the existing crossing point. The safety of zebra crossings depends on motorist and pedestrian behaviour. The study identified that most of the people using the crossing would use it immediately before and after school and that there were few users outside of these times. Studies have shown that if motorists often travel through a crossing with no one on it, this makes them less likely to slow down when coming to the crossing.

Traffic turning into and out of Dryden Avenue would also make a crossing point on Rolleston Drive less safe as motorists would have less time to see people using the crossing and often accelerate quickly when turning. When a zebra crossing is installed, pedestrians have the right of way, but in order for the crossing to be safe, people also need to exercise good judgment and not cross if cars are travelling quickly and don't have enough time to stop. If young children were to use a zebra crossing they may assume

that because they have the right of way they can cross without checking whether it is safe first. This problem may be worsened by the fact that many children are travelling quickly using scooters and may not slow down, stop and check the way is clear before crossing.

The Council has provided a walkway/cycleway on the west side of Broadlands Drive for students travelling to Clearview School to use. The undeveloped land on the opposite side is owned by the Ministry of Education. Until decisions have been made about how this land will be used in the future, planning for pedestrian access along this street and area can't be completed. The Council is in discussions with the school to look at other crossing options for students which could include having a crossing point which is supervised by parents.

Improving pedestrian crossing points and installing traffic signals at key intersections, including on Rolleston Drive, is one of the actions the Council will be looking at as part of the first stages of the Rolleston Town Plan and we are working with both Rolleston and Clearview Schools to look at what improvements could be made both this year and over the near future to improve safety.

The Council's Road Safety Coordinator, the School Principal and the Police will be meeting with parents of Rolleston School at 8.45am on Wednesday 20 August at the school to discuss short term options to help improve safety.
