Ellesmere Water Race Shutdown

Glenroy Community Irrigation Co. Ltd are temporarily shutting off the Upper Ellesmere water race intake and scheme to allow for intake maintenance.

The intake will be closed on 2 September and will be reopened on 4 September. Races affected include Rakaia Terrace, Sharlands, Waikimihia, Rakaia, Selwyn and Illingworth Roads and all off-shoots. The flow may take some time to reach all downstream users of the scheme.

Disruption to Water Race Service

Central Plains Water Water Race Crossings – Upper Ellesmere

September 2014 – March 2015

Central Plains Water (CPW) will commence laying the irrigation pipe network through the Upper Ellesmere Water Races in September 2014. Downer will be undertaking this work on behalf of CPW north of Main South Road. Work is scheduled to be completed in March 2015.

During this time water race flows may be impacted for a period of less than 24 hours for each crossing point however disruption to normal flows can be expected in the area over this period. Over pumping will be used where possible to maintain supply.

Public Notice Draft Selwyn 2031 – District Development Strategy

A hearing for Councillors to discuss and consider the submissions on Selwyn 2031 has been set for 25 – 26 August 2014. The hearing will run from 9am – 4pm on 25 August at the Darfield Service Centre and from 9am – 12pm on 26 August at the Rolleston Headquarters. The public are welcome to attend the hearing to listen to submitters presentations. However only those that have submitted and have asked to be heard at a hearing are able to speak. Selwyn 2031 is a high level growth strategy for the district and provides a framework for future development until 2031. The Selwyn 2031 strategy is focused on what Selwyn District Council can do under current legislation to manage population growth in a way that supports self-sufficiency of the whole district.

Following consultation on Selwyn 2031, 55 submissions were received. A Council staff report analysing the submissions received and outlining recommended amendments to Selwyn 2031 has been completed and circulated to submitters.
