aying safe at the Pool

Swimming is great exercise and fun for the whole family. If you are swimming in any pool, whether it's a public pool or your own pool, it's important that both children and adults exercise basic hygiene to ensure that bugs can't spread through the pool water.

If you are visiting the Selwyn Aquatic Centre we ask that you follow our poolsafe guidelines to keep the community in good health:

- if you or your child have had diarrhoea (upset tummy) recently, don't swim until two weeks after this has resolved
- babies should wear approved swimming nappies such as 'Little Swimmers.' These can be purchased from the Selwyn Aquatic Centre reception
- take children to the toilet before they swim and wash their hands after going to the toilet
- · where possible shower yourself and your children before you put togs on
- let pool staff know if you think someone has had an accident (if you see poo, blood or vomit in the water). They will advise when it is safe to go back in the water.

Please don't swim if you don't meet these criteria. You could be responsible for spreading your illness to other people and that's not fair to other pool users.

Selwyn District Council would like to remind dog owners to collect any mess their dog leaves behind when out in public.

We are aware that most dog owners are picking up after their dogs, but we do regularly receive complaints about owners that don't. Currently there are a number of spots in Lincoln where this is a problem including Lincoln Domain and in the wetland



area on Southfield Drive in Lincoln. Local schools in Lincoln have also previously had issues with this.

Stepping in a mess from someone else's dog is something that is guaranteed to spoil your walk or trip to the local park, so please be considerate and take a doggy doo bag with you to pick up after your dog. Owners who do not do this can be fined \$300. If you see another dog owner who doesn't clean up after their dog this can be reported to the Council, but we would need information to be able to identify the dog owner like a car registration number to investigate the complaint.

Animal Control staff will be increasing patrols of problem areas in an attempt to help ensure people comply with our bylaws.

Ellesmere Historical Society Remembering World War 1 Soldiers

Four soldiers from the Taumutu-Sedgemere-Lakeside area will feature. Tania Simpson will speak about Wiremu (Bill) Maopo. Tania has recently written a book, The Last Maopo, about him based around letters he wrote from the battlefields to the Sedgemere postmistress Virgie Fincham.

The history of Henry Pohio has been written by his granddaughter, Carol Hook of Wairoa, and will be presented during the evening. Pohio fought at Gallipoli and after being commissioned as an officer returned to New Zealand twice, to train recruits and accompany them to the Western Front.

Hohepa (Joseph) Teihoka sailed with the First Maori Contingent on 14 February 1915 and served at Gallipoli. After being evacuated from the Peninsula he returned to New Zealand because of Tuberculosis. Fiona Sloan his great

granddaughter will tell Joe's story.

Colin Patterson will speak about John R. Patterson who was wounded at Gallipoli and died on the troopship "Willochra" on 30 September 1915. The evening will show some of the New Zealand Memorials and cemeteries at the Somme in France and at Gallipoli.
