Funding Grants from Community Boards

Funding grants are available from the Malvern and Selwyn Central Community Boards. The grants normally range from \$400 to \$1200 and are dependent upon the discretion of the Boards. The Community Boards meet once a month – Selwyn Central on the third Wednesday and Malvern on the fourth Monday of the month.

The funding can support individuals, teams and organisations whose projects contribute to the strengthening of community wellbeing in Selwyn.

To be eligible for a grant, applications need to meet these criteria:

- Organisations based or working for Selwyn District, providing community, social, recreation, sporting or arts projects or activities in the District.
- Personal Growth and development for individuals who are contributing to community wellbeing in Selwyn such as leadership training, professional development or educational opportunities that are not part of school curricula
- Representation at events – individuals and teams for example representing school, team or community at a local, regional, national or international event
- Seed funding for special events or projects such as equipment, promotion, venue hire, or setting up a new team
- Capacity building and development for Selwyn based community organisations such as leadership training or small equipment purchases

Community Board funding is complementary to other funding sources. Priority is given to organisations or individuals who have sought other sources of funding or completed some fundraising towards their projects.

Do you want to help encourage the arts in Selwyn?

If you have an interest in the arts and want to support arts activities in Selwyn then you may want to join the Creative Communities Assessment Committee.

Registration of Interest Water Race Sub-Committee

Registration of interest is sought from users of the Selwyn District Council water race schemes in the Ellesmere Ward to join a committee that provides direct user representation into the management and operation of the Selwyn District Council water races and enables an input of local knowledge and expertise. The committee is comprised of 12 members with the following representation:

- Malvern, Paparua and Ellesmere Water Race Users – two each
- Paparua Water Race Irrigation User Group – one representative
- Community Boards – one Selwyn Central, one Malvern representative
- Council representative from Ellesmere Ward – one
- Christchurch City Council – one representing both Waimairi and Wigram Wards

The Water Race Sub-Committee is monitored by the Selwyn District Council, with engineering and secretarial support provided by Council staff. Meetings are held three-monthly, but no meeting fees or mileage reimbursements are paid. The term of office is three years.

Users of the water race system are invited to register their interest in joining this committee by submitting a summary resume of their background and interest in the management of the water race system.

Disruption to Water Race Service

Central Plains Water Race Crossings

Upper Ellesmere

September 2014 – March 2015

Central Plains Water have commenced laying the irrigation pipe network through the Upper Ellesmere Water Races. Downer will be undertaking this work on behalf of Central Plains Water north of Main South Road until March 2015.

During this time water race flows may be impacted for a period of less than 24 hours for each crossing point however disruption to normal flows can be expected in the area over this period. Over pumping will be used where possible to maintain supply.

Main pool temporarily closed



The 25 metre lap pool at the Selwyn Aquatic Centre in Rolleston will be closed from 6am on Monday 29 September and will reopen at 6am on Monday 6 October. During this period it won't be available for swimming. The closure will allow some tiles on the pool floor to be repaired.

The rest of the Aquatic Centre, including the hydrotherapy, toddler, learn to swim, leisure, lazy river and spa pools will be open as normal while the retiling is carried out. The centre is open from 6am – 9pm Monday-Friday and 8am – 8pm at the weekend and on public holidays.

During the period of the main pool closure, a hydro tone class will be held on Friday 5 October at 11am in the hydrotherapy pool, and other aquafit classes will not occur this week.

The retiling work coincides with school holidays. During term time the pool is heavily used for swimming lessons and it is disruptive for maintenance work to occur when lessons are scheduled.
