New library and roading changes planned for Rolleston Town Centre



A new library, roading improvements, a public square and children's play area are planned for central Rolleston

Rolleston's population is expected to increase from 12,000 now to around 20,000 by 2030. It will become increasingly important as a hub for business, shopping and as an entry point to the new motorway.

As part of our Long-Term Plan, improvements are planned so that our roads and facilities can cope with the town's growing population and activity.

A new library is planned for Rolleston, to open in 2019. The current library was opened in 2000, when Rolleston's population was less than 2,000 and its population is now over 12,000. The library is the busiest in Selwyn but has the smallest building and does not meet New Zealand Standards for Public Libraries as it is too small for its population.

The proposed new library would be designed as a 2200m2 facility. A larger building will allow more books to be displayed and have more space for reading. It would have meeting rooms and a technology suite. This flexible, multi-purpose facility could host a wide range of events, from story time sessions to exhibitions and school holiday activities. It would provide research space and could be used by people from across Selwyn. The new library would attract people into Rolleston's town centre and encourage them to visit nearby shops. As part of the Rolleston Town Centre Master Plan a central shopping area is planned around Rolleston Drive between the Warehouse, the New World supermarket and the north-eastern portion of Rolleston Reserve which is the proposed location for the new library.

An upgrade to Tennyson Street is planned to add attractive paving, street trees, and parking. The water race along the street will be piped from Rolleston School to Lowes Road so that a footpath can be developed along this side of the road.

Other works planned are an extension of Moore Street from Tennyson Street to Norman Kirk Drive, and the extension of Wordsworth Street to Tennyson Street. The Wordsworth Street extension will provide a new slow speed road connecting to the reserve, library and new retail areas. An extension of Markham Way to Norman Kirk Drive is also planned along with traffic calming works, to provide a walking and cycling link through this area.

Due to increasing traffic, the Council is planning to upgrade a number of key intersections. The Tennyson Street/Rolleston Drive, Masefield Drive/Rolleston Dr and Lowes Road/Tennyson Street/Springston Rolleston Road intersections will be upgraded with traffic signals which will include pedestrian crossing facilities.

New roundabouts are planned at Tennyson Street/Kidman Street, Tennyson Street/Moore Street and Levi Road/Lowes Road/Lincoln Rolleston Road /Masefield Drive. The creation of a cycleway along Rolleston Drive towards the State Highway and upgrades to pedestrian crossing points are planned in 2015/16 to improve safety for children using these areas.

The Council is also proposing to develop a public square and a new children's play area at Rolleston Reserve.

Further research and consultation on the future demand for space for recreation, sports and community activities in Rolleston is planned. These activities could be located as part of the library (which would increase its cost) or they could stay at Rolleston Community Centre.

Speed Limit Change for Springfield

The New Zealand Transport Agency will lower the speed limit on State Highway 73 through Springfield from Thursday 23 April. The Transport Agency's Highway

Manager Colin Knaggs says there has been significant development in the town during the last few years which means the existing 70km/h speed limit on the highway is no longer appropriate. "The new 50km/h area will begin 180m south-east of Tramway Road and run through to 265m north-west of Pall Mall Street."
