

This August, Selwyn households are being invited to sign up to the Selwyn Gets Ready website and go into the draw to win one of five household emergency 'grab and go' kits valued at \$145. The kits contain 23 items including a first aid kit, a torch with radio, an emergency tent and blanket, water purification tablets, and large water container. To join the website and go into the draw, visit www.selwyn.getsready.net by 31 August and enter your details. If you've already registered through the system you'll also go into the draw.

The Selwyn Gets Ready website is a database which contains contact information for local residents. This information is used by local community response teams to identify who needs assistance in an emergency and who has skills or resources (like first aid skills, generators and four wheel drives) that could help in a disaster. In a disaster a network of community response teams operate in Selwyn and each team is responsible for checking on the welfare of their community, identifying what needs to be done in their area and requesting assistance if needed.

The Selwyn Gets Ready system can also be used to send texts or emails warning people of severe weather or other emergencies. Through the system, access to household information is restricted to local community response teams and cannot be viewed by the public.

A recent example of the system in action occurred in January when a fire at Flock Hill threatened Castle Hill township. The system was used to text and email people advising them to be ready to evacuate if needed. The local community response team also visited local houses to warn people in person. Fortunately the fire was brought under control and Castle Hill did not need to be evacuated.

Selwyn ski fields offer free skiing to children when accompanied by a skiing adult, and have season passes and different concession packages available.

Check you have the right design before you build a fence

If you are building a house, or are a developer or builder, it's important to check your fence meets Council requirements before you construct it.

There are particular requirements around the type of fencing that can be built in some urban residential areas (properties within a Living Z zone and within the Lowes Road Outline Development Plan area). Some fences have been constructed in these areas which do not meet District Plan requirements.

The Council's District Plan contains information on where and how fencing can be development so that a Resource Consent is not needed. The Council has also developed a fencing pamphlet with advice and examples of good fence design, in particular along street frontages. This pamphlet has already been distributed to some households. It is available at the Environmental Services counter at the Council's Rolleston Headquarters. A more detailed fencing guide is available online at www.selwyn.govt.nz/fencing-guide.

Good fencing design can help to create a safer and more pleasant neighbourhood where people enjoy walking and cycling along footpaths and cycle paths. A fence that is at the boundary of a road or reserve is also part of the street scene and the 'public eye' and needs to be designed so it is in harmony with these public areas.

The responsibility and costs to remove or change fences that do not meet District Plan requirements lies with the landowner, so please contact the Council before you start building a fence. For advice on fencing rules please phone 03 347 2800 and ask for the Duty Planner.

Help us improve broadband and cellphone access

In July, Council submitted a proposal to the government requesting that they provide ultra fast-broadband in Darfield/Kirwee, Lincoln/Tai Tapu and Leeston Southbridge.

The application also requests that broadband be improved in Malvern in the area to be covered by the Central Plains Water scheme, and that mobile phone access along State Highway 73 from Springfield to Otira be improved for locals, emergency services, tourists and tourism operators.

To support our application the Council is preparing a Digital Enablement Plan. The Plan will summarise Council and community actions to support improved broadband and mobile phone services.

Darfield/ Kirwee has been prioritised as the first area the Council has requested the government provide ultra-fast broadband to. Meetings in Darfield and Springfield are planned to gather information from businesses and the community about what issues people in these areas (and rural Malvern) are experiencing and what the Council could consider doing to increase fast broadband uptake, improve mobile phone coverage and increase people's digital skills and knowledge.
