

A new 350 hectare horse-riding area is being developed in Selwyn

The area will be part of the Waimakariri River Regional Park. At least 10km of trails will be developed in the forest between Chattertons and Weedons Ross Roads to provide a safe environment for horse riding away from vehicles. Parking for horse floats and toilet facilities will also be provided.

being developed The trails are being developed by Environment Canterbury, with support from Selwyn District Council.

David Owen, Environment Canterbury Regional Parks Team Leader, said the new facility is being developed in response to demand from local horse-riding enthusiasts. "With the Selwyn District experiencing significant growth in recent years, there is now even more demand for outdoor amenities that local people can enjoy."

"We have been working closely with the Selwyn District Council to secure funding and develop a plan for the new area and we've met with interested parties and formed an advisory group. Fulton Hogan is also contributing to the project by providing direct assistance with staff and machinery."

The development will be completed in stages and it is expected the facility will be open by early autumn 2016.

The Waimakariri River Regional Park hosts a range of activities including mountain-biking and walking, trails and trail bike riding, fishing and general river access. It is also an important biodiversity and conservation location.


Ken Stevens, a case manager from the Ministry of Social Development, will be visiting Selwyn in September to run information seminars explaining entitlements for superannuitants.

LOCAL FUNDING GRANTS

Funding grants are available from the Malvern and Selwyn Central Community Boards, and from the Ellesmere and Springs discretionary ward funds. The grants normally range from \$400 to \$1200. Community Boards meet once a month to consider applications – Selwyn Central on the third Wednesday and Malvern on the fourth Monday of the month. The Springs and Ellesmere Discretionary Fund Committee meet each fortnight at regular Council meetings. The funding can support individuals, teams and organisations whose projects contribute to strengthening community wellbeing in Selwyn. To be eligible for a grant, applications need to meet these criteria:

· organisations are based in, or

working for, Selwyn district, providing community, social, recreation, sporting or arts projects or activities in the district.

personal growth and development for individuals who are contributing to community wellbeing in Selwyn such as leadership training, professional development or educational opportunities that are not part of school curricula representation at events –

individuals and teams, for example, representing school, team or community at a local, regional, national or

international event seed funding for special events or projects such as equipment, promotion, venue hire, or setting up a new team

capacity building and development for Selwyn based community organisations such as leadership training or small equipment purchases

Local funding is complementary to other funding sources. Priority is given to organisations or individuals who have sought other sources of funding or completed some fundraising towards their projects. For further information on additional funding criteria and an application form visit www.
