

Selwyn residents will soon have a new cycleway to enjoy. Minister of Transport Simon Bridges announced last week that Selwyn was one of 13 areas to receive funding from a new Urban Cycleway Fund.

Mr Bridges says this is the beginning of a programme that will change the face of cycleways in New Zealand using clever funding leveraging.

"By pulling together multiple funding sources, the Urban Cycleways Programme will get high-quality projects underway much sooner than may otherwise have been the case."

In Selwyn, the funding will go towards creating a new 9km cycleway linking our two largest towns, Rolleston and Lincoln.

This funding will be combined with additional support from the New Zealand Transport Agency as a joint initiative to improve the districts cycling facilities.

Selwyn Mayor Kelvin Coe says the Council is delighted to receive funding for the project. "We expect the cycleway will be well used by students travelling to Lincoln High School, people commuting to work and Selwyn residents using the new cycleway to access community facilities in both townships."

The cycleway will run along Lowes Road, Lincoln Rolleston Road and Boundary Road. From there, cyclists will be able to connect up to the existing Railtrail path which runs from Lincoln to Christchurch and Little River.

The development of a new cycleway between Rolleston and Lincoln was programmed for the future, but the national funding assistance will enable the project to be completed this year. The design and construction of the new cycleway is expected to be completed by June 2015.

The development of the cycleway is being jointly funded with \$300,000 coming from the government's Urban Cycleway Fund, and the New Zealand Transport Agency and Selwyn District Council each funding \$275,000.



Water bills out for Rolleston

If you are connected to the Rolleston town supply, you should have received a water bill recently. In Rolleston the cost of providing water is met by having a fixed charge (this is currently \$200) which is included in your rates bill and from a water meter charge based on your usage of water.

The most recent bill covers the period from July 2014 to the beginning of January 2015. For most households, your latest bill is likely to be higher than your previous bill for January-June 2014. Watering your lawn and garden consumes the most water of any activity for residential properties. In 2014 most of the rainfall in Rolleston occurred in January-June, and the amount of rainfall in July-December was much lower than normal, so most households would have had noticeably higher water consumption in the second half of 2014, and therefore a higher water bill. The charge for water also increased in July 2014 from 33 cents per 1,000 cubic litres of water to 40 cents per 1,000 cubic litres of water. 1,000 cubic litres of water is enough to take up to eight baths. If you think your water bill is too high, it is a good idea to check your property for leaks.

At the recent Board meeting, members received an update on Council's draft policy for managing psychoactive substances and on training opportunities for community committee representatives.

The Board recently allocated a number of grants. One of these was to the Rolleston Combined Churches to print flyers for the Community Christmas Carol Service. Funding was granted to an individual towards costs of attending the Scout World Jamboree in Japan later this year; and a grant was made to another individual towards the cost of a World Challenge trip to Borneo.

The Board will hold their bi-annual Volunteer Awards on 17 June during Volunteer Awareness week. Nominations will open in May. Drive Safe around school children


Over 8,000 children are now returning to school in Selwyn. Children will be travelling on the bus, by car, biking, walking and using scooters to get to and from school. With so many children on the move, motorists will need to take extra care before and after school.

Safety tips for drivers:

- watch out for children when they are crossing the road. If children are on scooters they can move quickly.
 Whether they are on bike, walking or on scooters children may not have the skills to judge if it is safe to cross. so slow down if they are near a crossing
- \cdot back into your driveway so when you leave the house in the morning you will have a clear view of any children crossing your driveway
- · if you are passing young cyclists on the road, give them plenty of space as they may be inexperienced
- · always reduce your speed to 20 kilometres when you pass a stationary school bus. Look out for children who are on the roadside, or are getting on or off the bus
- \cdot slow down around schools and other areas children travel along to get to school

Safety tips for parents:

- talk to your children about how to use their bike or scooter safely and how to check it is in a safe condition to use
- make sure your child is familiar with their route to school and knows how to cross any roads safely
- helmets must be worn by cyclists and are recommended for children on scooters. Hi-viz vests also help make children more visible to motorists
- if your children catch the bus talk to them about safety. They should stand well back from the road and wait until the bus has gone and there is a clear view both ways before they cross the road
- check all children are correctly restrained if you drive children to or from school
- when picking or dropping off children at school, ask your children to get in and out of the car on the footpath side of the car and don't park near yellow lines, intersections or driveways.

Water restrictions in place

Please note that water restrictions are still in place for properties connected to these Council water supplies: Doyleston, Kirwee Leeston, Lincoln, Prebbleton, Rolleston, Springfield and West Melton. The restrictions mean you can't water lawns between 6-9am or between 4-9pm. Restrictions are expected to remain in place during the summer and into early Autumn. Garden watering is allowed at any time.

Tai Tapu water supply

A replacement pump with more capacity has been successfully installed and the water supply is now operating as normal once more. The restrictions on watering lawns and gardens have been lifted. Thank you.

Low Flows in Water Races

Due to the current dry conditions being experienced over the Canterbury Region it has become increasingly difficult to create a sufficient flow in the water races throughout the district. A number of rivers have become exceedingly low, impacting the intakes at the Upper and Lower Kowai, Haldon, Glenroy and the Lower Rakaia. This causes problems in ensuring all properties are supplied with stock water.

In order to help improve flows, property owners are encouraged to clean and maintain water races to improve downstream flows to other users. The Council appreciates your help with this.
