Selwyn Community Board News

The Board recently held its July meeting in Rolleston. Members discussed the recent drone activity and received a briefing from the Chief Executive regarding the current rules under the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA). The meeting also received a briefing around Council's application to Central Government for broadband funding assistance and also received an update regarding the latest progress made on the Rolleston Town Master Plan.

The Board allocated grants to the following:

- St John's Ellesmere to help with costs of sending two leaders and two cadets resident in Selwyn Central to the St Johns International Cadet Competition to be held in Hong Kong in January 2016
- Rolleston Indoor Bowls Club to buy a new set of bowls
- The West Melton Gymnastics Club to compete at a gymnastics competition in Hokitika at the end of July.

Planning is underway to attend the Rolleston Reserve fireworks again later this year. The Board are also planning to host a small event around International Volunteer Day in December 2015.

Keep your dog away from lambs

Lambing season is now underway and dog owners are reminded they need to take extra care when exercising their dogs in rural areas.

"Many urban areas of Selwyn back on to rural areas and dogs may not be used to the temptations of rural life such as newly born livestock. It is important that dog owners are aware of this to prevent any incidents from happening," says Selwyn District Council Senior Dog Control Officer Steve Clarke.

To ensure your dog is under control, know where your dog is at all times and stay out of areas where there are other animals. If your dog is not familiar with livestock you may need to walk them on a leash. Kennels and fences should also be checked so that your dog can't escape from your home when you're away.

Because dog attacks are common in New Zealand, dog owners need to be aware of the legal consequences if their dog harms another person or animal:



- Dog owners can be issued a warning or infringement notice
- Dog owners can be prosecuted and if convicted, fined up to \$3,000 if the dog attacks a person, stock, poultry, domestic animal or protected wildlife, on top of any charges for damages
- Dogs may also be impounded and/or put down if they attack people or animals.
