

Try something new in July



Baby massage is one of the new classes available in Term 3

New term three programmes start soon at Rolleston Community Centre and Lincoln Event Centre.

Over 30 different classes are running during term three at the centres, with options for pre-schoolers, school age children, adults and older adults.

Both centres offer baby gym and mini gym sessions which help to develop movement, play and coordination skills. Lincoln Event Centre also hosts a weekly little feet dancers preschool dance class to music, and Rolleston Community Centre offers Rumpus Room sessions for preschoolers to play and learn on child friendly gym equipment. Rolleston Community Centre is also offering a new baby massage class this term. The classes cover massages to relax your baby for sleep or calm them when they are upset and improve colic. Classes are suitable for babies from birth to one year and enrolment is required. Sessions for children include basketball and skating.

Classes for adults include Tai Chi and badminton at both centres, and boot camp sessions, table tennis and yoga at Lincoln Event Centre. A range of fitness classes are also available including circuit, pump and zumba. Rolleston Community Centre is also offering beginner and intermediate level sign language classes and sports activities for people with intellectual disabilities.

For older adults both centres offer low impact fitness classes for seniors, while Rolleston Community Centre also hosts 'move it to music' an exercise class suitable for people with arthritis or limited mobility. Both centres also host regular day club get together sessions for senior citizens offering friendship, fun activities and a hot meal.

Term three classes start the week of 20 July and run until September, with enrolment in advance required for many classes. To find out more about the classes available visit www.lincolneventcentre.co.nz, www.rollestoncommunitycentre.co.nz or drop into the centres.

Malvern Community Board News

The Board held their June meeting in the Greendale Hall. A number of locals attended the meeting and spoke to a number of issues. They also indicated their huge support of the Malvern Community Board in their District. They highly regard the Malvern Community Board's advocacy on their behalf.

Issues raised included:

- cell phone coverage, black spots and broadband issues
- Roading and the need for repairs as well as strengthening of roads
- state of roadside verges after road works completed
- a database of services in the Selwyn District
- communication with residents via radio ads when there are weather events to let them know of proposed ETA's of power reinstatement
- burnoffs
- request for recycling services

The Board allocated grants to the following:

- Darfield High School 1st XV was granted funds towards their annual end of year season tour to play Timaru Boys and Kings High Schools.

Register my dog online?

During July dog owners will need to register or re-register their dogs. Owners need to register by 31 July and registering your dog by this date enables you to take advantage of a discounted dog registration rate.

This year we have introduced online dog registration. The new system allows you to register your dog from home. To use the system you need your customer and dog owner number. Dog owners who provided the Council with their email address would have received an email from Council on 23 June with this information. If you didn't receive an email you should have been posted dog registration papers last week with these numbers. Whether you received an email or were posted papers you can register your dog online.

To use the new system please visit www.selwyn.govt.nz and select the dog registration story on the website homepage. Click on the link provided in the story which will take you to the registration form. You will need to create a user name and password which you will use again to register your dog next year. Once you've done this please check your details are correct on the online form. If you need to change your address, add or take off a dog you can do this on the web page. Then you can make an online payment.

Once you have completed registration payment a strip or disc dog tag will be posted to you within two weeks. If this is not your preference please email dogrego@selwyn.govt.nz with your owner number.

If your dog registration papers were posted rather than emailed to you, this is because we don't have your email address so please contact dogrego@selwyn.govt.nz with your owner number and your email address. This will allow us to email you in the future regarding dog registration.
