

A Sport and Recreation Have a Go Day is coming to Selwyn in June. This free family friendly event is hosted by Selwyn District Council and local sport and recreation groups and is happening on Sunday, 21 June from 12-3pm at Lincoln Event Centre. The day allows you to try out try out 20 different sport and recreation activities offered by local clubs.

There are activities to suit all ages and abilities. Indoors you can have a go at: American football, badminton, basketball, body audit, hula hoops, older adult exercise classes, pump classes, spin class, table tennis, yoga and zumba. Outside you can try: archery, football (inflatable field), golf (inflatable targets), lawn bowls, pedalmania, skate boarding, softball and walking. For the littlies there will be mini gym, scouts and bouncy castles. The Selwyn Youth Council will be operating their pop up café, a live band will be playing, and there will be a sausage sizzle.

To take part in the day, grab a Have a Go Day passport, complete at least five simple challenges, and get your passport stamped! Once you've completed the passport you can enter the main prize draw for a chance to win a \$250 sport voucher, gifts from Selwyn Community Pharmacy, Tea House vouchers, or Sportsmed Lincoln massage vouchers. Ray White and Challenge in Lincoln are also supporting this event.

Have a Go Day Passports are available from Thursday 4 June at Selwyn Libraries, the Lincoln Event Centre, Rolleston Community Centre or Council offices in Rolleston. Passports will also be available to collect at the Have a Go Day. The Have a Go Day will be on rain or shine, with many of the outside activities moving indoors if it is wet.

Learn a new language with Selwyn Libraries

You can now learn a new language for free with Selwyn Libraries through Mango languages. Mango languages is an online language learning system that can teach you over 60 languages from around the world. Language options include Spanish, Russian, French, English, Mandarin and many more. It allows you to learn about the culture of your chosen language, vocabulary, pronunciation and grammar from its native speakers.

"Mango is a great resource because it offers a range of languages and levels of intensity so you can tailor your learning experience to most suit your needs. Using the app on your smart phone or tablet makes it a really flexible and portable way to learn, and the range of languages means that for just about anywhere you chose to visit, you will be able to say "Hi!" in the local language," says Selwyn Library's Digital Services Librarian Christine Grant.



To access Mango Languages

To access Mango from the Selwyn libraries website (www.selwynlibrary.co.nz) type 'Mango' in the search box on the home page. To log on to Mango you need your library card membership number and your library pin number (your pin is the last four numbers of your membership number unless you have changed this). This will take you to the Mango website and allow you to sign up for a free Mango profile. You will need to create a profile to track your progress. Select which language you would like to learn. Click the 'Get Started' button to begin a course. Mango is a self-paced learning system which allows you to learn at your own speed. You can save your progress at any point and pick up from where you left off next time you log in.

Each lesson has multiple chapters with different conversational scenarios from real life situations like visiting a café or meeting people. There is a narrator to help you through each exercise. If you have a microphone on your computer, you can also record your voice and compare it with a native speaker's.

Once you've created a Mango language account through Selwyn Libraries you can also download the app from the Google Play or iTunes store by searching 'mango languages' and use this on your iPad or Android tablet. This allows you to learn anywhere, anytime. If you would like help to use this service, contact Selwyn Library staff on 03 347 2876 and they will be happy to help.

Three of the designations are considered to be a "roll over", that is that they were existing designations as at 2000. A further 16 sites are new designations and one site (Darfield) is proposed with Spark New Zealand Ltd as a secondary requiring authority. All 20 sites are for the continued use of the existing facilities and activities associated with the proposed purpose. The proposed purpose for each site is to be 'telecommunication, radiocommunication and ancillary purposes. Further information of the notice

Don't let hot ashes start a fire!

Now the weather is cold many households are lighting fires inside the home to keep warm. Putting hot ashes straight from the fire into your wheelie bin or rubbish bag can easily start a fire and melt your bin. If you damage your bin you may be charged to have it replaced.

Before putting ash into the rubbish bin, cool these for at least five days, stir ashes and/or put cold water on them. Ash should not be placed in organics bins. When you are selecting firewood please note that treated timber cannot be used under Environment Canterbury rules, as it releases harmful chemicals like arsenic into the air.
