

June marks the official start of winter and with winter comes the risk of snow.

Snow is common in Selwyn during winter and has the potential to cut off power and telephone services and close roads.

Selwyn District Council Emergency Manager Officer Ryan O'Rourke says that now that winter is here, it is important for people to ensure their household is well prepared to cope with snow.

"The further away from a main town you live, the better your preparations need to be as you could be housebound for several days until roads can be cleared and power restored. However a

large snowstorm could cut power to main towns like Rolleston, Lincoln and the surrounding areas so everyone needs to be ready to cope with that situation."

To prepare your household for snow you can take the following steps:

- have several days' food and bottled water, medication and a first aid kit, a portable battery operated radio, torch, matches, baby food and supplies, cutlery and can opener, and warm clothing stored in a waterproof container
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ have an alternative power source and another way of cooking food if the power fails
- \cdot if you have a fireplace, check you have several days' supply of firewood or coal
- · keep your vehicle fuel tank near full to avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines
- · on the farm; plan where livestock can be moved to shelter and ensure there is enough dry feed. Consider how you would supply stock water if the power is off. Most animal deaths in winter storms are from dehydration
- register online to join Selwyn Gets Ready at www.selwyn.getsready.net. The website helps communities to prepare for an emergency by providing information on who needs assistance in an emergency and what skills and resources (like generators and first aid skills) are available in your neighbourhood
- \cdot get to know your neighbours and find out whether they need assistance, or could help you, in an emergency.

If a snow storm hits then:

- · listen to your radio, or television, and visit the Council website, www.selwyn.govt.nz, for weather reports and emergency information
- · ensure you drink enough water and watch for signs of frostbite or hypothermia. Wear several layers of loose fitting, light, warm clothing
- \cdot keep rooms well ventilated when using gas or kerosene heaters to avoid toxic fumes building up
- \cdot bring pets inside and move stock to shelter
- · report broken utility lines to Orion
- \cdot check on your neighbours and help them out if they need assistance
- \cdot avoid driving unless absolutely necessary. If you have to travel take snow chains, warm clothing and essential emergency items in case you become stuck
- · if you are caught in your vehicle in a snowstorm, stay there and make yourself visible by tying a bright-coloured cloth to your radio aerial and keep the inside light on.

Could your group help in an emergency?

If your community group has volunteers who could help in a Civil Defence Emergency, then we would like to hear from you. We are particularly interested in hearing from groups who could help run emergency welfare services (such as helping run a welfare centre, cooking or registering displaced people). Council website speeds up national rankings

Selwyn District Council has been named runner up in a Supreme Council Website Award. Selwyn's website was placed second out of 78 Council websites evaluated by the Association of Local Government Information Management (ALGIM), moving up the rankings from eighth place in 2014.

ALGIM evaluates all New Zealand council websites, based on their compliance with web standards, web accessibility testing for the visually impaired and on mobile devices, and response times to email and Facebook enquiries. In 2015, the evaluation process used was changed to give greater weight to independent performance assessments of website performance.

"The Council undertook a refresh of our home page and content structure in early 2014. As part of this change we also introduced a top content section on the page which links to our most visited pages like rates, the Selwyn Aquatic Centre, our District Plan and building consents," says Selwyn District Council ICT Applications Support Officer Deb Webb. "A 'Do It Online' function was also added so people can quickly find services that can be completed online."

"Looking to the future the Council plans to continue working to make more services accessible online – for example this year people will be able to register their dog and pay dog registration fees online."

The Council is also planning to do further research on how people are using the website to identify what other improvements to make so it is easier to use.

In 2014 our website was viewed by 148,157 people on 313,329 visits, with 1,071,697 individual pages viewed

LEESTON STORMWATER BYPASS – STAGE 1 WORKS

Leeston residents were surveyed in May 2014 on options to upgrade the stormwater system to cope better with heavy rain and reduce the impacts of flooding on the township. 77% of those residents who took part in the survey said they supported work being undertaken on the stormwater system with the option with the most support being to progress with the Leeston North Bypass and investigate options for a Harman's Road extension.

The Council has recently been reviewing and updating the original bypass design consented by Environment Canterbury. The first stage of the upgrade works will be undertaken by Grant Hood Contracting starting 8 June through to September 2015. These works include upgrading the following drains and

culverts:

- · CDHB drain between Cunningham Street and Manse
- High Street drain between Manse Road and the showground culverts (the showground culvert upgrade is planned for future stages)

Traffic management will be in place on Manse Road and High . Street as required during this time. For further information see the Council website, www. selwyn.govt.nz or contact Council's Water Services Engineer on 03 347 2800.
