

Winter officially begins on 1 June and it brings more challenging driving conditions including rain, fog, ice on the roads, and often snow. Daylight hours are also shorter, and visibility is often poor during the morning and evening rush hours when many people are on the roads.

"During winter, allowing extra time for journeys so you can defrost your car before starting and travelling more slowly on wet or icy roads is very important," says Selwyn Road Safety Coordinator Ngaire Tinning. "If visibility is poor in the morning or evening or due to gloomy conditions or fog, putting your lights on will make your vehicle more visible to others and will make your journey much safer."

"Driving too fast on wet or icy roads can easily lead to a crash, especially on bends," she says. If you travel in the morning or evening in frosty conditions, reduce your speed as ice is likely to be present, and see our driving tips below. Ice can also be a problem during the daytime on patches of road shaded by trees or fences, so watch out for this

More free windscreen cloths and ice scrapers will be available in early June from Council Library/ Service centres.

Driving tips for winter:

Driving in the wet: stopping distances nearly double on wet roads. You need to:

- \cdot Slow down and keep a generous distance from the car in front of you
- \cdot The two-second rule should be a four second rule

and reduce your speed before entering these areas.

· Be extra vigilant – take corners slowly. Watch out for road signs warning of flooding and allow more time to stop in wet conditions

Driving in snow and ice: go slow on ice and snow:

- \cdot Whenever possible, avoid driving in heavy snow and ice
- \cdot If you cannot avoid driving on snow or ice, then slow down, allow for much greater braking distances and avoid braking suddenly
- \cdot If you're driving on a winding road, keep left and drive slowly, as you could quickly lose control
- · Watch out for ice in shaded areas, particularly if it has been wet. After snow melts, there is likely to be ice, especially in shaded places and bridges
- \cdot You should also carry chains, know how to fit them and use them when necessary

Driving in fog: turn on your headlights, not just your park lights. You should also:

- · Reduce your speed as visibility is poor and keep a large following distance
- \cdot Keep your headlamps on low (dip) beam, as high beam will reflect off fog and produce glare Only use fog lamps when visibility is severely reduced. It is illegal to use fog lamps in clear conditions as they can dazzle other drivers.

Driving with sun strike: sunstrike generally occurs early morning and late afternoon. Familiarise yourself with the areas where it happens and take more care at these locations. Always keep your windscreen clean, inside and out, and reduce your speed.

Exercise your dog

Did you know that there are over 25 reserve areas where dogs can be exercised in Selwyn? If you've visited your own park plenty of times, you could try somewhere different - there are lots of pleasant scenic spots to choose from.

Dogs can be exercised either on a leash or off leash in these areas but dogs must be under control. Under control means that the dog obeys commands and doesn't bother or cause a nuisance to other people or dogs. If you're outdoors please remember that dogs are not allowed in schools, in skate parks, or within five metres of events on sportsfields or reserves. They are also not allowed in playgrounds or within five metres of a playground.



Places you can exercise your dog off leash include:

Ellesmere ward: Coes Ford Recreation Reserve, Chamberlains Ford Recreation Reserve, Dunsandel Domain, Leeston Park, Osborne Park, Southbridge Park, Rakaia Huts Recreation Reserve

Malvern ward: Castle Hill Domain, Darfield Reserve, Glentunnel Domain, Greendale Domain, Kirwee Recreation Reserve, Sheffield Domain, Whitecliffs Domain, Kowai Pass Domain

Selwyn Central Ward: Brookside Park (Rolleston), Foster Dog Park (Rolleston), Rolleston Recreation Reserve, Springston Recreation Reserve, Weedons Reserve, West Melton Domain

Springs ward: Lincoln Domain, Prebbleton Domain, Rhodes Park (Tai Tapu), Greenpark Reserve

If you are out with your dog in public, please remember to take a doggy doo bag with you and collect any mess your dog leaves behind so our parks are left clean for everyone to enjoy.

Water restrictions lifted for West Melton and Springfield

Watering restrictions have now been lifted for properties connected to the West Melton water supply. Restrictions were in place due to Environment Canterbury restrictions on groundwater take for bores supplying West Melton. Ground water levels are now recovering, allowing the restrictions to be lifted.

Watering restrictions have also been lifted for properties connected to the Springfield supply. Restrictions were in place as the town is supplied by treated water from the Kowai River and the river was experiencing low flows due to weather conditions. River levels have now risen, enabling the restrictions to be lifted.

The lifting of restrictions mean that lawns and gardens may be watered at any time. The Council still encourages property owners to water lawns and gardens after 9pm and before 6am where possible, as this is the time of lowest water use and also provides the best opportunity for water to soak into the ground. We appreciate your cooperation while restrictions were in place.

Are you eligible for a rates rebate?

Applications for rates rebates for 2014/15 are still open. If your gross household income to 31 March 2014 was \$30,000 or less and you pay rates on the property you live at, you may qualify for a rebate. If your income is more than this you may still be eligible depending on the cost of your rates and the number of dependants in your family. To find out if you are eligible visit www.ratesrebates.govt.nz. Application forms are available on this website and from Council service centre/libraries.

If you have not yet applied for your rebate for the current rating year you have until 30 June 2015 to do so. You can apply for a rates rebate for next year once you receive your first rates invoice in August 2015.
