

El Nino conditions are forecast to affect Canterbury over spring and summer. The El Nino is predicted to be the strongest since 1997-98. This is likely to mean a dry spring and summer which will increase demand for water.

Rainfall has also been low in 2015, so ground water levels have not had the opportunity to recharge well over winter. Ground water levels and river flows are starting to show signs of stress.

So that we can continue to supply households with water over summer, we are asking residents on Council water supplies to try to avoid watering lawns between 6am-9am and 4pm-9pm daily. These are times when households use the most water.

During a particularly dry summer water supplies are placed under pressure as many people decide to water their lawns and gardens at the same time in the evenings. Demand is particularly high at the weekends in the evenings.

Between 9pm and 6am is the best time to water lawns as demand for water is lowest and water has the opportunity to soak into the ground. If you are considering watering your lawn between 9am and 4pm please check the weather conditions first (see our advice below).

In 2015 an additional bore was installed for Rolleston, and new bores are being installed later this year for Prebbleton and Lincoln. In Doyleston, a second pipe was constructed earlier in the year to connect the town's reservoir to the pipeline supplying the town from Leeston. This is helping to provide Doyleston with more constant water pressure. In Leeston an upgrade to the well has also been completed to provide both Leeston and Doyleston township water supplies with more capacity.

If demand for water increases over summer then water restrictions may be introduced requiring households to avoid watering lawns at specific times. Summer water restrictions are commonly used in New Zealand as a way to manage demand for water.


When to water your lawn

Don't irrigate

Between 6-9am or 4-9pm daily

Check weather conditions before watering

We recommend you check weather conditions before watering at this time. Watering your lawn during the middle of the day during hot days or when a Nor' West is blowing results in a lot of water evaporating and watering in these conditions is not recommended. Watering on a cooler overcast day is a better option as provides the best opportunity for water to soak into your lawn or garden.

Rating revaluations out soon

Property owners in Selwyn will receive an updated rateable value for their property over the next week.

Since a rating valuation was last carried out for Selwyn in 2012, there has been a 21.8% overall increase in capital values in Selwyn. The 2015 revaluation was carried out by Quotable Value (QV) on behalf of Selwyn District Council.

Business properties showed the sharpest rise in property values between 2012 and 2015, with the capital value of these properties rising by an average of 40%. The value of farming properties also rose more than the average for Selwyn – with the capital value of farms rising by 28%. Residential property values rose by an average of 19%, but property value increases vary by township.

Around 27% of Selwyn District Council rates are set based on the capital value of a property, with some rates also set based on a fixed amount per property (such as for library services). Some services such as building and resource consents are funded through user charges for services.

Most property owners will find that the capital value of their property has increased, however this doesn't indicate they should expect to see a large increase in rates. Rates are set annually on 1 July based on the amount of income the Council needs to provide services. As the average increase in capital value for Selwyn was 21.8%, property owners whose values increased more than the average can expect a higher than average rate increase from 1 July 2016. Property owners whose capital value change was less than the Selwyn average can expect a lower than average rates change next year.

Property owners can object to the valuation if they wish to.The letter outlining your new valuation has information on how to make an objection. Objections must be lodged by **17 December** 2015.

The rating value reflects the likely price a property would sell for on 1 July 2015 - the effective date of the valuation - excluding moveable chattels like curtains and appliances.

On the roads this week

Road repairs are planned to Bellam, Ellesmere, Marshs (between State Highway One and Shands Road), and Trents (between State Highway One and Blakes Road) Roads with stop and go signs being used by contractors to control traffic.

Road repairs are also planned to Telegraph (between State Highway 1 and Highfield Road), Two Chain, Leeston Lake and Wards (between Courtenay and Aylesbury) Roads, which will remain open with traffic controls in place. Work to remove high shoulders along roadsides will take place along Ellesmere, Ellesmere Junction and McDrurys Roads and traffic controls will be in place.

This week resealing work is planned along Feredays, Burts, Tramway and Heslerton Roads. Stop and go signs will be used for traffic control. Maintenance grading work is planned around the Darfield, Sheffield, Hororata, Lincoln and Tai Tapu areas, with roads remaining open.

Where work is not completed this week, work will continue next week.
