

Are you looking to get in shape, meet new people, or learn new skills? Rolleston Community Centre and the Lincoln Event Centre have some great new programmes starting in February which can help you do this.

You can learn New Zealand's third official language - sign language at a new class running from 9 February on Mondays from 7.30-8.30pm at Rolleston Community Centre.

You could also get tips on how to save money on power, water and petrol from sustainable energy expert Mike Evans at a resource conservation workshop at the centre on Tuesday 10 February from 10-11.30am. If you are thinking about installing solar water heating, a workshop on different models, costs and benefits is planned on Thursday 12 March, from 7.30-9pm at Rolleston Community Centre.

The Lincoln Event Centre has three new fitness classes: Spin, Start Up, and BAT (butt, abs and thighs). Spin classes run on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday for 45 minutes. Places need to be booked in advance and a discount is available for monthly pass holders. Classes start on Tuesday 3 February. Start Up classes run for nine weeks from Thursday 5 February and give participants a taste of circuit, weights, core, walking and outdoor fitness equipment. You also receive your own personalised activity programme. BAT is a beginner to intermediate level class, designed to tone your burn, abs and thighs. BAT starts Wednesday 4 February.

# Visit our Sister City Coventry, USA

As part of a Sister Cities friendship relationship a trip to Coventry, Rhode Island, in the United States is planned in early October and applications are being invited to join the trip.

Applications close 20 February

The trip is at your own expense and includes spending two weeks in Coventry in homestay accommodation, with the opportunity to visit either the Fryeburg Agricultural Show or Deerfield New Hampshire Show, and historical mill sites near Coventry such as Mass and Slater Mill Museum. Trips to Boston including Harvard University, Cope Cod Marine Park and two days in New York are also planned. The cost of the trip is around \$4,000-\$5,000 per person.

Three places are available on the trip for active, fit adults who live or work in the Selwyn District, with applications being considered by the sister city committee and Council staff.

### Buy a bus ticket?

In Selwyn, Metrocards can be purchased or topped up at the Council's Rolleston Headquarters (open Monday – Friday 8.30am-5pm) and at the Lincoln University Students Association, located up Gate 2 beside the Student Union Car park. There are a range of other locations in Christchurch where you can purchase or top up your card – see www.metroinfo.co.nz/metrocard. You can't buy a Metrocard on buses, but you can top up your card on a bus or online.

When you are buying a new Metrocard you will need to bring ID with you, such as a driver's license, birth certificate, passport, Cando Card or school identification with your name and date of birth on it.
