

Selwyn school children are returning to school this week and motorists will need to take extra care on the roads. To help ensure children get to and from school safety, the Council has the following safety tips for motorists and parents:

Safety tips for drivers:

- · slow down around schools and watch out for children when they are crossing the road on foot, bike or scooter. Children may not have the skills to judge if it is safe to cross, so slow down
- back into your driveway so when you leave in the morning you will have a clear view of any children crossing your driveway. This is also a good idea if you have children in your household
- \cdot give young cyclists plenty of space as they may be inexperienced
- · reduce your speed to 20 kilometres when you pass a stationary school bus, regardless of which side of the road the bus is on. Look out for children who are on the roadside waiting to catch a bus, or are getting on or off the bus

Safety tips for parents:

- talk to your children about how to use their bike or scooter safely and how to check its condition to see it is safe to use. Make sure they are familiar with the route to school and know how to cross any roads safely
- · helmets must be worn by cyclists and are recommended for children on scooters. Hi-viz vests help make children more visible to motorists
- · if your children catch the bus talk to them about standing well back from the road and waiting until the bus has gone and there is a clear view both ways before they cross
- · if you drive your children to school, check they are correctly restrained before you leave
- · when picking or dropping off children at school, ask your children to get in and out of the car on the footpath side of the vehicle. Don't park near yellow lines, intersections or driveways

Rubbish, Recycling and Organic collections will occur as normal on Monday 8 February when the public holiday for Waitangi Day is observed.

Look out for your rates invoice and water meter advice

Over the next week quarterly rates invoices will be posted or emailed to Selwyn ratepayers. Rates are due for payment by 2 March 2016.

Rolleston and Edendale households have recently been posted their water meter bills for the six months to January (with readings taken in mid-January). When you receive your rates invoice you will also find a postcard explaining how to read your water meter so you can keep track on your water use. Your water meter bill account lists your water meter reading as the 'present meter reading.' If you think your bill is too high, turn off all taps and check whether the spinner on meter (shown on the postcard diagram) is moving as this indicates you may have a leak.

If you live in another area, and are connected to a Council water supply and have a blue water meter box on your property (see photo below) please read the water meter postcard included in your rates for advice on managing your water use with your water meter.

The water meter dial is cumulative so it doesn't reset itself to zero each year. You may want to make a note of your current water meter reading, so you can compare your water use next time you check your meter. For Rolleston and Edendale households water meter charges are billed every six months. Compared to other areas, Rolleston and Edendale households pay a reduced water charge of \$200 per year and 40 cents for every cubic metre of water.

In other areas, water use is monitored for a year running from 1 July – 30 June. If you have a meter and use more than 375 cubic metres of water in the year to 30 June 2016, there is a charge of 40 cents per cubic metre for any water used over 375 cubic metres.



Precautionary Boil Water Notice lifted - West Melton

A Precautionary Boil Water notice issued last week has now been lifted for the Council's West Melton water supply after water sampling results indicated the water supply reticulation is free from e.coli.

A precautionary boil water notice was issued when e.coli levels were found to be above recommended levels at one of the scheme's water treatment plants. The treatment plant was promptly isolated from the water supply reticulation. All water supply reticulation samples have been clear of e.coli indicating the water supply was not contaminated.

Drinking water no longer needs to be boiled. The Council would like to thank West Melton residents for their cooperation while the notice was in place.

On the roads this week

Seal repairs are planned to Kimberley, Tramway and Old West Coast Roads (between Waddington and Waimakariri Gorge Road. Resealing work is planned on Robinsons, Adams, Trices, Wylies and Bellam Roads. Stop and go signs will be used for traffic control at these locations and at seal repair sites. Road repairs are also planned on Bealey, Deans and Goulds Roads (between Lowes and Dynes Roads), with traffic controls operating. Footpath repairs will occur beside Birchs and Springs Roads.

Where work is not completed this week, it will continue next week.

Closure of part of Jones Road

From 9 February until 11 March, Jones Road will be closed between Weedons Ross and Hoskyns Road to allow the installation of a rail siding on Jones Road. The rail siding will be used by Lyttelton Port Company at their new MidlandPort site which is currently under construction.

A marked detour will operate via Weedons Ross, Maddisons and Hoskyns Road during the closure. Work also includes the formation of an entranceway and right hand turning bay into the site and associated road widening and reconstruction works at the sites main entrance and rail siding.

The installation of new water and wastewater pipes and fibre cables along Jones Road to Hoskyns Road to service MidlandPort will also take place during the closure. The road closure allows these works to be coordinated by contractors while avoiding the lengthy delays that could occur along Jones Road had the road remained open while work occurred.

Vehicles using the detour should expect a short increase in travel times and some delays at main intersections, especially during peak travel times (weekdays 7.30-9am and 4-6pm).
