

An extension to Leeston skate bowl has now opened, doubling the size of the skate area.

The skate park was completed in late 2012 and features a four foot-deep skate bowl.

The new extension includes a large flat concrete skating area suitable for all skate levels, and new rails and ramps have been added. Additional landscaping around the extension area has also been completed. Grass has also been sown to grow over winter, and people are asked to stay off fenced off areas to allow the grass to establish. The skate extension was completed by Hunter Civil Ltd with landscaping by Greenlinc.

"The skate extension area provides an area which is suitable for younger children on skateboards or scooters to use as it has a flat surface and lower ramps, but it can also be used by more advanced skaters," says Dave Greig, Selwyn District Council Landscape Architect.

An extension to the skate area at Westview Park in Darfield is being undertaken by the Council currently, with the work expected to be complete this winter.

Celebrate Matariki

During June Selwyn residents are invited to join in celebrations for Matariki – the Māori New Year.

On Saturday 25 June a free event is planned featuring renowned artist Marcus Winter (pictured) who will tell the Māori story of creation through sand pictures. The celebration will also include Ngāi Te Ruahikihiki performing a mihi whakatau (welcome), and kapa haka performances by local high schools in collaboration with the Te Taumutu Rūnanga. The event is funded by the Selwyn District Council and will take place at Lincoln University from 2.30-5.30pm. AA services in Rolleston

You may have heard that vehicle licensing fees are reducing from 1 July. From this date the ACC levy portion of vehicle licensing fees will reduce for most vehicles.

If you decide to renew your car licence at an office you can do this at the AA office at the Council's Headquarters in Rolleston (open Monday-Fridays 8.30am-5pm) or at a post shop.

In June, AA agents can process vehicle licence applications that apply from 1 July at new reduced fee levels.

The AA branch at the Council's Rolleston Headquarters offers a range of other services in addition to vehicle registration. Services include processing driver licence registration applications, driver theory tests and booking driver practical tests, passport photos, and international driver permits. For driver licensing queries phone 0800 822 422 and for vehicle registration queries phone 0800 108 809.

To avoid queues you can licence your vehicle online at www.nzta.govt.nz/online. It is slightly cheaper to licence your vehicle online than at an agent but you need to allow time for your new licence to be posted to you.

Find out more about standing in Selwyn local elections

An information evening for people considering standing in this year's local elections will be held on **Thursday 30 June** from 7-8.30pm at the Council's Rolleston Headquarters.

The evening will cover a range of topics including the nomination process, the criteria for standing for election, the skills needed by elected members and the role they play, remuneration, the election process and training provided.

Nominations for candidates open on 15 July and close at noon on 12 August. Voting is by post and voting papers will be posted on 16 September with voting closing at 12 noon on 8 October.

To be eligible to stand you must be a New Zealand citizen over 18 and enrolled on the parliamentary electoral roll. You'll need to complete a nomination form and have two people nominate you who are over 18 are enrolled to vote in the area you are standing. A deposit of \$200 is also required, which is refunded after the election.

On the roads this week

Work to extend Broadlands Drive to connect to Springston Rolleston Road and install a new roundabout at the junction is continuing. Power undergrounding and streetlight installation work is continuing on Tennyson Street in preparation for a new roundabout being installed on the Kidman Street/Tennyson Street junction.

Gravelling and road reshaping work will take place on Wabys Road with one lane closed for works and traffic controls operating, and on Morgans Road with the road remaining open. Drainage improvement works will take place on Torlesse Road, with the road remaining open.

A new shared walkway/cycle path continues to be developed between Coalgate and Glentunnel. The new shared off road cycleway/ walkway down Rolleston Drive (between McCauley Street and State Highway 1) to connect Rolleston's town centre to Izone has now been completed apart from the establishment of the grass berm and shared path markings. This pathway (pictured) also provides an off road cycleway for children getting to Rolleston School. A new bus shelter has also been installed opposite McCauley Street.

Maintenance grading will occur in the Burnham, Coalgate, Dunsandel and High Country areas. Installation of reflective road edge marker posts will also be occurring around the district.

COMMUNITY FUNDING GRANTS

Funding grants are available from the Malvern and Selwyn Central Community Boards, and from the Ellesmere and Springs discretionary ward funds. The grants normally range from \$400 to \$1200. Community Boards meet once a month to consider applications – Selwyn Central on the third Wednesday and Malvern on the fourth Monday of the month. The Springs and Ellesmere Discretionary Fund Committee meet each fortnight at regular Council meetings. The funding can support individuals, teams and organisations whose projects contribute to strengthening community wellbeing in Selwyn. To be eligible for a grant,

applications need to meet these criteria:

- organisations are based in, or working for, Selwyn district, providing community, social, recreation, sporting or arts projects or activities in the
- personal growth and development for individuals who are contributing to community wellbeing in Selwyn such as leadership training, professional development or educational opportunities that are not part of school curricula

representation at events individuals and teams, for example, representing school, team or community at a local, regional, national or international event

seed funding for special events or projects such as equipment, promotion, venue hire, or setting up a new team

capacity building and development for Selwyn based community organisations such as leadership training or small equipment purchases

Local funding is complementary to other funding sources. Priority is given to organisations or individuals who have sought other sources of funding or completed some fundraising towards their projects.
