

The Council has adopted its Annual Plan for 2016/17 which includes extra funding for new footpaths, funding for the development of a large-scale park and a change to how some rural

The average rates increase for 2016/17 is 4.1%, incorporating a 3% increase in the general rate. Rate increases will vary by township and for properties based on the services they receive and as a result of property revaluations carried out in late 2015.

126 submissions were received to the draft plan. As a result of submissions the Council will increase the budget for footpath extension work from \$100,000 to \$500,000 to bring forward the development of around six kilometres of new footpaths next year. The new footpaths will add linkages to the existing footpath network. Work to widen Jones Road between Weedons Ross and Hoskyns Roads has also been brought forward to 2016/17, as more traffic is being generated by development on this road.

The Council confirmed a proposed funding plan for a new large-scale park. Part of the cost will be funded from development contributions from new subdivisions, and the balance from a rate of \$20 a year per property. The park is located north of Rolleston and is expected to be developed from the 2020s onwards.

Hororata Acheron, Malvern Hills and Te Pirita water schemes will also move to a more standardised water charge. The change will also result in a small increase in the district-wide water rates and charges for other properties connected to Council water supplies.

Local projects planned in Ellesmere this year include purchasing land to extend Southbridge Park and restoring Cemetery Pit, and building the Dunsandel Community Centre. In Malvern, McHughs Forest Park will continue to be developed and a major water treatment plant upgrade is planned at Springfield. In Selwyn Central a new community and recreation centre will be built at West Melton, and new reservoirs installed at Rolleston and West Melton to provide more water storage capacity. In Springs ward, a new sewerage pump station and rising main and a new well will be constructed at Prebbleton, while a new water reservoir will be developed at Lincoln to provide more water storage capacity.

Explore Selwyn Visit Arthur's Pass this winter

There are two short walks in Arthur's Pass that make for a great day trip for the family.

The Old Coach Road walk is located 6km south of Arthur's Pass village and begins near Greyneys Shelter. This forest walk follows a gently-graded section of the century-old coach road and leads back to the shelter on a more recent track. Sections of old rock-walling are still visible in places.

The Millennium walk begins outside the Arthur's Pass Visitor Centre, and follows a path that leads to a little stone bridge where you can view the Avalanche Creek Waterfall. Small trout are often seen from the historic bridge. From here, steps lead up to a viewing booth where you can see the waterfall more closely. After this walk, you can treat yourself to a coffee and lunch at one of the cafes that are outside the entrance to the waterfall.

Volunteers ready to aid their communities

Selwyn residents have been learning basic first aid in case local communities need their help in an emergency.

The Council recently funded first aid skills training for 15 civil defence volunteers who are part of local community response teams. The training aimed to assist volunteers to respond in case anvone in their community needs first aid in an emergency and health services are overwhelmed, unavailable or too far away.

35 community response teams operate in most areas of Selwyn. They are responsible for checking on the welfare of their community, helping to respond in an emergency and reporting to the Council if they require assistance.

"It updated me on current thinking such as when to use elevation, how to manage choking, compression rates for CPR, bandaging a head wound, how to check circulation and how to deal with a bleeding exposed bone fracture," says Lee Brehaut from the Doyleston Community Response Team, who attended the training. "It provided a great reminder about how to recognise strokes and heart attacks, signs of shock, treating and managing burns and using a defibrillator.

Matt Joynes from the Whitecliffs Community Response Team also took part in the course. "As a father of two small children in a rural and sometimes quite isolated area, I was very aware that I have little in the way of first aid knowledge if something went wrong. Other than dialling 111 I wasn't sure what I'd do, and that scared me. In a small community, with a range of age groups and needs, the skills to help in emergency situations are vital. The course has allowed me to build a good understanding of what to do in various scenarios, which should enable me to assist in my community should the need arise. It has also given me a level of confidence that I did not have previously."

Matt says he would recommend the training to others. "You never know what life will bring - the more people that have these sort of skills under their belts, the more lives that may be saved.'

Don't let fires reignite

An open fire season is currently in place in Selwyn's rural plains area. While outdoor fires may be lit there are a number of fire safety guidelines that must be met. Before you light a fire please visit www.selwyn.govt.nz/fire to check the rules.

Even in winter, local volunteer fire fighters are still attending some escaped burns or older fires which have reignited. It's important that you stay with a fire until it is fully extinguished and check that all fires, including fires lit some days ago, are fully extinguished with no heat left. Check under the bottom of the fire embers to see if it is fully out. No burning is permitted at night or when moderate-strong winds are occurring or forecast.

Under Environment Canterbury air rules, to prevent smoke pollution only dry vegetation which has been cut at least six weeks prior may be burned.

In hill and high country areas a permit is required for outdoor fires year-round. Outdoor fires are not allowed in residential areas under Environment Canterbury rules, except for barbeques

ROLLESTON RESERVE EXCHANGE PROPOSAL

The Council is proposing to exchange the reserve status of 4.3 hectares of Rolleston Reserve for 30 hectares of land at Foster Park. This proposal would see part of the Rolleston Reserve having its reserve status removed, with this reserve status transferred to land at

The proposed exchange is a significant step in the development of Rolleston's town centre, as it will enable part of Rolleston Reserve to be redeveloped for a range of community and commercial activities to create a vibrant town centre for Rolleston, as envisaged in the Rolleston Town Centre Master Plan. This proposal follows on from having the land needed for the town centre development zoned under the Land Use Recovery Plan. The remaining section of the reserve would be developed into an exciting urban park with a range of features that may include a playground, youth park and other elements such as a community pavilion and water feature The playcentre, scouts facility, tennis/netball courts will remain at the park. The change of use at the park has been proposed for some time. A drop-in session on the proposal will be held on Tuesday 19 July from 6-8.30pm at the Council's Rolleston
