

We are now surveying our community on what you would like our district's environment to be like in the future.

The survey is the start of a project which will run over the next few years to review the council's District Plan. The District Plan controls the activities allowed on different properties, where shops, industrial areas and new housing is located and is also designed to protect our environment.

Selwyn is the fastest growing district in New Zealand so our district has been changing rapidly. The survey aims to find out what people like about our district now and what they would like to see in the future. As part of the District Plan review, more consultation is planned over the next few years on specific topics.

"In May this year we carried out our annual Resident's Survey which included a question about whether people thought Selwyn was a great place to live. The survey found that most people thought Selwyn was a great place to live and many people mentioned they liked Selwyn's rural feel or that our district had a good mix of townships and rural areas," says Mel Renganathan, the Council's Strategy and Policy Advisor. "In this survey we want to find out what aspects of our district help create the rural feel that people like."

The survey is available at www.selwyn.govt.nz/haveyoursay. It takes around five minutes to complete and is open until 4 December. Some of the things the District Plan controls include:

- · How much new development is allowed, where new sections are located and how sections and homes are designed
- · What type of buildings are allowed in different areas
- · What activities you can carry out on your property for example whether business activities are allowed, and if so, what types of activities
- · Activities in your neighbourhood that could affect your enjoyment of your property for example noise limits that apply, whether you can keep certain animals, and how high neighbouring buildings can be built which could affect your privacy and light
- \cdot Where shops and industrial areas are allowed and what rules are in place in these areas
- · Where farming can occur and what farming activities are allowed without a resource consent
- · Rules to protect special features like heritage sites or special environmental areas

On the roads this week

East Maddisons Road is open to traffic travelling from Goulds Road to Selwyn Road while work continues to seal the road and complete other works. It is closed to vehicles travelling from Selwyn Road to Goulds Road. Road repairs are planned on Leaches, Bealey, Old Tai Tapu and Marshs Roads, with traffic controls in place.
