

Voting papers are being posted to registered electors in Selwyn this week for local elections. The local elections are held by postal vote.

Voting papers must be returned by 12 noon on Saturday 8 October – please post your voting papers back promptly to ensure your vote counts or return them to a ballot box at a Council service centre.

Local councils provide a wide range of services that you use every day – from libraries, to roads, water, parks, events, building consents and community centres – so it's important to vote on who you want to represent you.

In Selwyn, you will be voting for the Mayor, local ward Councillors and if you live in Malvern ward, Malvern Community Board members. You will also vote for one Environment Canterbury Councillor to represent the mid Canterbury Area, and for seven Canterbury District Health Board members who are elected at large from across Canterbury. Your voting papers include candidate profile information to help you decide who you want to vote for and instructions on how you can vote.

If you haven't received your voting papers by this Friday 23 September please contact the Council so we can issue special voting papers to you. Electoral staff can mail voting papers to you or you can visit the Council's Rolleston Headquarters or Darfield, Leeston or Lincoln Library and Service Centres to collect your papers. Share your photos of Rolleston's past

Selwyn Libraries are inviting local residents to find photos from Rolleston's past and present and have them digitised for display at the Rolleston 150th celebrations.

Rolleston Library will host a digitisation day on Sunday 25 September from 1-5pm.

"We're looking for photos from Rolleston's past, along with recent images to be considered for display at the Rolleston 150th celebration in October," says Selwyn Libraries Manager Vicki Carlyon.

"The images will help create a story about Rolleston's origins and how the town has developed over time," she says.

"To help develop the presentation we would like a variety of images from the past and present which will appeal widely to people. These could include photos of local landmarks like schools, major shops and parks, people at work and at play, important events in our history and other images that create a picture of what life was and is like in Rolleston."

People are invited to bringing along images, slides and negatives they have at home which will be of interest to the wider public so that they can be digitised. To participate in the day people also need to sign a digitisation agreement allowing libraries to keep a copy of images in Selwyn Libraries digital collection for future use. Alternative scanning arrangements may need to be made for large collections which can't be scanned on the day.

Normal library services will also be available at the event so people can browse for books and enjoy a coffee. Anyone who would like a digital copy of their image will need to bring a USB stick with enough memory capacity.



Water supply upgrades add capacity and improve quality

Water supply improvements are helping to provide higher quality water for our growing population.

The Council is part way through a programme to add capacity to water supply systems in high growth areas and to improve water treatment quality for a number of smaller townships.

Since 2015, Rolleston, Prebbleton and Lincoln have all had new bores added to supply these areas. Another bore has been developed at West Melton which is expected to start operating by summer. A new deep well has been drilled at Edendale which replaces the existing well, as dropping groundwater levels indicated the bore would soon go dry.

In Doyleston, a second pipe was constructed in 2015 to connect the town's reservoir to the pipeline supplying the town from Leeston and more tank storage has been provided for Doyleston's supply. These are helping to provide Doyleston with more consistent water pressure. In Leeston an upgrade to the well and a new high capacity pump has also been completed which provide both Leeston and Doyleston township water supplies with more capacity.

While Council water supplies now have extra capacity, water use is also affected by groundwater levels and Environment Canterbury consent limitations on water takes. In August, Environment Canterbury warned that Canterbury was experiencing its third year of dry weather, with most wells it monitors showing low or very low groundwater level and some wells at their lowest levels in the 30 years it had been recoding data. In dry summers, Council water supplies are managed to ensure that household water use is given priority over providing water for watering lawns. With the current low groundwater levels, water restrictions are likely to be imposed over late spring and summer.

In Springfield, a new UV treatment and filtration upgrade has been designed to improve water quality. Currently the water is treated by chlorination. The UV treatment system is expected to be completed by June 2017. UV treatment systems are also being planned for Sheffield and Hororata water supplies.

Currently, the Council uses a variety of water treatment methods for our 30 water supplies and all supplies have Water Safety Plans approved by Canterbury District Health Board which set out water treatment standards. Treatment methods used in various supplies include secure ground water (to meet New Zealand Drinking Water Standards), UV and filtration, and chlorination of the Acheron, Castle Hill, Dalethorpe, Hororata and Springfield supplies.

DISCONTINUANCE OF PART STOCKWATER RACES

Ellesmere, Malvern and Paparua

Selwyn District Council advises

its intention to discontinue the following sections of water races, pursuant to the Local Government Act 2002:

Paparua

1. Closure of 0.2km of race through one property between Jones Road and SH1 east of Curraghs Rd (Council)

Malvern

2. Formalise the closure of 1km of race through one property on the intersection of Creyke Road and Miles Road (Schnel)

Fllesmere

3. Closure of 2km of race through two properties north of Southbridge Leeston Road (Lill)
