Dog bylaw – we want your opinion

We're looking to offer more spaces for you to take your furry friend to run around – and we're looking for your feedback.

The Council is now undertaking public consultation on changes to its Dog Bylaw, which include the addition of several new areas where off-leash exercise is permitted, and additions to the list of schools and other locations where dogs are prohibited.

Proposed new off-leash exercise areas include Foster Park (Rolleston), Leeston Dog Exercise Area, McHughs Forest Park, Preston Avenue Reserve (West Melton), Coalgate Recreation Reserve, Dryden Reserve (Rolleston), Edendale Reserve, Waihora Domain (Motukarara), and Westview Park (Darfield).

Schools added to the list of areas prohibited to dogs include Rolleston College, West Rolleston School, and Lemonwood Grove School, along with the Darfield and Prebbleton skate parks.

On the roads this week

The intersection of Hoskyns Road and Sandy Knolls Road is being upgraded and a change of priority will occur this month so that traffic approaching from Sandy Knolls Road will need to stop. Traffic delays may occur and detours may operate while the upgrade occurs.

Construction of a right turn bay is continuing at the intersection of Dynes Road and Springston Rolleston Road, with traffic controls in place at this location. Care is needed when driving through the site.

Cattlestop cleaning and ford reinstatement is occurring on Algidus Road. Flooding repairs will be occurring at various areas across the district.

Slip removal and repair work is continuing on Malvern Hills Road.

Sewer line installation work is continuing on Shands Road and Selwyn Road – traffic delays may occur due to this work.

Christchurch Southern Motorway Extension–NZTA

From Monday 31 July the CSM2 project team continue to fell trees along the north-bound side of Main South Road between Robinsons Road and Waterholes Road. This will be carried out using Stop/Go setups between 9am–4pm and will create queues. We recommend allowing more time for your journey or using alternative side roads.

Report a pothole

Potholes breed like rabbits in the rain!

After the recent flooding across the district you may have noticed an increased number of potholes appearing on Selwyn roads. Council staff are working to fix these but with around 2,500 kilometres of roads in Selwyn it's hard for staff to stay on top of every stretch of road.

You can help us by reporting a pothole to our team so that we are aware of it and can then take steps to repair it. There are a number of ways you can do this.

If you have a smartphone you can download a free app called Snap, Send, Solve. This app is very simple to use, it asks you to take a photo of the pothole or other issue, it then identifies the location using the phone's GPS data and sends an email to the Council from your email address, including the incident type, notes, address of incident, photo, and contact details. The report is then allocated to the relevant Council department who will take the appropriate action.

You can also report a pothole by filling out a Helpline form on our website at www.selwyn.govt.nz/contact-us/helpline. This form asks you for details about your issue and your contact details so that Council can let you know when the issue is resolved. You can also call our Helpline on 347 2800 and speak to our friendly staff.

Rates rebate applications open soon

Rates rebates applications for eligible Selwyn ratepayers will open from Monday 14 August.
The rates rebate scheme is a nationwide programme which provides a rebate of up to \$620 for low
income earners who were paying rates for the home in which they were living on 1 July 2017.
Rebates are calculated on total household income, the level of rates and the number of dependants.
The income limit for a rebate is \$24,790 although ratepayers with income over this amount may still be
entitled to a rebate depending on their total rates cost and number of dependents.
A rates rebate calculator and example tables are available on the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA)
website: www.ratesrebates.govt.nz. Application forms are available from the DIA website, or from Council
service centres. You will be asked to provide accurate information about your income, and that of any
partner or joint home owner who lives with you, for the tax year ended 31 March 2017.
From 14 August to complete an application you can visit the Council’s Rolleston headquarters during
opening hours (8.30am–5pm Monday to Friday), no appointment required.
You can also apply at one of our Library and Service Centres, by making an appointment for a personal
consultation – please phone Darfield 318 7780, Lincoln 347 2876 or Leeston 347 2871.
