

Virtual invasion at Lincoln Domain



Lincoln Domain is coming to life with animated dinosaurs, kittens and alien invaders during the July school holidays.

The reserve is the second park in Selwyn to become a 'Magical Park' where children are guided by an app that allows them to herd kittens, see dinosaurs brought back to life, and witness an alien invasion.

"The app involves children in a number of fun tasks at parks such as finding dinosaur eggs, which provides a great workout," says Selwyn District Council Senior Events and Recreation Advisor Dave Tippett.

"Rolleston Reserve became our first Magical Park in April and the app has been popular with local kids since then. We are excited to share the magic by launching the app at Lincoln Domain."

The 'Magical Park' app is designed for kids aged 6–11. It can be downloaded free from Google Play or the iTunes App Store. It is compatible with iPhone 5 and above, iPad 3 and above, or android devices with a compass, gyroscope, accelerometer and GPS.

The average playing time for kids using the app is 30–60 minutes and in this time kids typically cover between 700 metres and 2 kilometres.

Magical Park will launch at Lincoln Domain on Wednesday 5 July and will be active in the domain's eastern area near the entrance to Lincoln Event Centre. Kids can also explore Rolleston Reserve as a Magical Park – look out for signage near the skate area for information on how to use the app.

Prebbleton sewer pipeline progress

Good progress is being made on a new 10km sewer pipeline linking Prebbleton to the Selwyn Road pump station. The pipeline has been designed to carry wastewater flows from Prebbleton village once fully developed (based on current land use planning projections). The pipeline connects to the existing network at the intersection of Springs and Hamptons Roads. From there it travels alongside Hamptons and Shands Roads to Selwyn Road and to the Selwyn Road pumping station. From Selwyn Road wastewater is pumped to the Pines Wastewater Plant for treatment. The new pipeline is on track to be completed in early August.

Both Prebbleton's and Lincoln's populations have been growing rapidly and in the future the existing pipe network won't have enough capacity to service both areas. Lincoln and West Melton, which also connect to Pines Wastewater Treatment Plant, all have their own pipes linking directly to the Rolleston network.

Prebbleton's wastewater currently flows to Lincoln and from there both the Lincoln wastewater (which also services Springston) and Prebbleton wastewater are pumped to the Selwyn Road pumping station. The new network arrangement caters for expected growth in Prebbleton and also avoids double pumping of Prebbleton flows to two locations.

On the roads this week

The intersection of Hoskyns and Sandy Knolls Roads is being upgraded and a change of priority will occur in July so that traffic approaching from Sandy Knolls Road will need to stop. Traffic delays may occur and detours may operate while the upgrade occurs. Sewer line installation work is continuing on Shands and Selwyn Roads - traffic delays may occur due to this work.

Cattlestop cleaning is planned on Lyndon and Harper Roads. Traffic controls will operate at all sites. Road works are planned on Algidus, Bethels and Wabys Roads with traffic controls operating. Footpath construction will be occurring on Liffey Springs walkway.

Bridge replacement continues on Jarvis Road with the road closed. A turning bay is being created at the intersection of Dynes and Springston Rolleston Road, with traffic controls in place at this location.

Christchurch Southern Motorway extension – NZTA

From Thursday 6 July, Weedons Road, between State Highway 1 and Levi Road, will be one-way for approximately six weeks while utility works are carried out. Detours will be in place. Traffic will be able to travel onto Weedons Road off State Highway 1 towards Levi Road.

Movies are suitable for children aged 4–13 and their families. Entry is \$2 per person – booking not required.
- **Rogaine Rampage** – Join a fun cross country navigation sport similar to orienteering where you use clues, a map and a GPS unit to visit control points. The sessions run at Rolleston Community Centre on Monday 10 July from 10am–12pm and 1–3pm. Suitable for kids aged 8–13. Booking required to attend – see dashtickets.co.nz. \$5 per child.
- **Winter Pool Fest** – Fun daily activities take place at Selwyn Aquatic Centre from 1–3pm during the week of Monday 10 to Friday 14 July. Choose from inflatables (Monday), aqua volleyball and obstacle course (Tuesday), paddle boats (Wednesday), giant inflatables and games (Thursday), paddle boats and aqua handball (Friday). \$3.20 per child, suitable for children aged 6–13 (with caregiver supervision required for children under 8). Lincoln Rail Trail link under way

A new off-road link to connect Lincoln to the Little River Rail Trail is
now under construction. The new shared cycleway/pathway will link
Lincoln to the existing Rail Trail at Ellesmere Road through a mainly
off-road route.
The link will be developed in two stages. The first stage will run
from Liffey Springs Park to the Lincoln Stormwater Wetland and is
now under construction with a new pedestrian/cyclist bridge over
the L2 River at Liffey Springs Park recently lifted into place. A new
water crossing point will also be added at the wetlands.
The second stage of construction is being financed by the Little
River Rail Trail Trust, with a construction date for this work to be
confirmed. This will see a new section of pathway added from
south of the wetlands along the L2 River to connect to Moirs Lane
and the start of the existing pathway at Ellesmere Road.
