

Here is a summary of Selwyn District Council services and opening hours during the holiday period.

The Selwyn Aquatic Centre is closed Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day. On other days from 27 December–2 January it will be open from 8am–8pm. On Christmas Eve (Sunday 24th) and New Year's Eve (Sunday 31st) the Centre will close at 6pm instead of 8pm. Normal hours (6am–9pm) resume from Wednesday 3 January 2018.

Rubbish and recycling collections scheduled on Christmas Day (Monday 25th) will take place the prior Saturday 23 December. Refuse collections scheduled on New Year's Day (Monday 1 January) will take place the prior Saturday 30 December. All other collection days will proceed as normal.

Pines Resource Recovery Park is closed Christmas Day and New Year's Day. It is open 10am–4pm on Tuesday 26 December (Boxing Day), and Tuesday 2 January. All other days are normal opening hours (9am–4.30pm weekdays and 10am–4pm on weekends).

The Council's Rolleston Headquarters close at 12 midday on Friday 22 December and reopen with normal hours (8.30am to 5pm) on Wednesday 3 January.

Selwyn District Libraries close at midday on Friday 22 December and will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day and the day after New Year's Day.

Darfield Library will be open Saturday 23 December 9.30am–12.30pm and Friday 29 December 1–4pm. Leeston Library will be open Saturday 23 December 10am–1pm and Thursday 28 December 1–4pm. Lincoln Library will be open Saturday 23 December 9.30am–12.30pm, Wednesday 27 December 10am–1pm and Friday 29 December 10am–3pm. Rolleston Library will be open Saturday 23 December 9.30am–12.30pm, Wednesday 27 December 10am–1pm and Thursday 28 December 10am–3pm. Normal libraries hours resume from Wednesday 3 January.

Rolleston Community Centre closes at midday on Friday 22 December and reopens with normal hours on Wednesday 3 January.

Lincoln Event Centre closes at midday on Friday 22 December and reopens with normal hours on Wednesday 3 January.

The last day for booked building inspections will be 21 December. Inspections will commence again on Wednesday 3 January.

The Council's helpline will be operating 24 hours a day over the Christmas and New Year break for urgent issues – phone 347 2800 or 318 8338 (Darfield).

Restricted Fire Season in place for summer

Selwyn district is now in a Restricted Fire Season as set by Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) on Saturday 9 December.

With dry, hot conditions pushing fire risk toward dangerous levels, fires cannot be lit in the open without a permit from FENZ. Gas cookers and barbecues do not need a permit.

ICC Under19 Cricket World Cup is coming to Selwyn

In January next year the next generation of future cricketing stars will descend upon New Zealand's shores for the ICC Under19 Cricket World Cup 2018.

Selwyn is hosting 17 matches at the Lincoln Green and Bert Sutcliffe Oval at Lincoln University during the tournament, including the plate quarter finals, semi-finals and final. Entry to all games is free.

This will be the 12th edition of the tournament and the third on New Zealand soil, following previous events in 2002 and 2010. We will join Whangarei, Tauranga, Christchurch and Queenstown in hosting 48 matches throughout the tournament. Canterbury will host 26 matches across four venues; Rangiora Oval (Rangiora), Hagley Oval (Christchurch), and Bert Sutcliffe Oval and Lincoln No.3 (Lincoln).

The ICC U19 Cricket World Cup has become a common pathway for players with a number of former greats having featured in past events including Michael Clarke (Australia), Brendon McCullum (New Zealand), Inzamam-ul-Haq (Pakistan) and Brian Lara (Windies). Some of the current international cricketing stars, who have graduated from previous ICC U19 Cricket World Cups and have become household names include Steve Smith (Australia), Kane Williamson (New Zealand) and Jason Holder (Windies).

See all the action as 16 teams compete for the title currently held by defending champions West Indies. Gates open at 9.30am with all matches commencing at 10.30am. Come along to watch today's future stars from New Zealand and other competing nations play for the first time on the international stage. It just makes Water Sense!

Residents on Council water supplies are encouraged to continue using their Water Sense.

So that we can continue to supply households with water over summer, and to help conserve water, we are recommending that residents on Council water supplies try to water lawns between 9pm-6am (most recommended) or, on cooler overcast days, between 9am-4pm.

Please avoid irrigating between 6-9am or 4-9pm as these are times when households use the most water and pressure can drop with high demand. Pressure drops have been observed over the last few days.

If demand for water increases over summer, water restrictions may be introduced requiring households to avoid watering lawns at specific times. Summer water restrictions are commonly used in New Zealand as a way to manage demand for water.



Garden waste and scrap metal drop-off days good for our environment

Two community garden waste and scrap metal drop-off day in Malvern and Ellesmere have collected over 29 tonnes of garden waste which will now be composted, along with over 8 tonnes of scrap metal for recycling.

The two drop-off days were held near Leeston and Darfield providing residents with an alternative drop off point for their waste. Over the two days, 163 vehicles dropped off their garden waste and scrap metal for a small charge. The events were staffed by the members of the Ellesmere Heritage Park and the Malvern Lions Club, with assistance from Council contractors. Funds from the days have been donated to both charities with the Ellesmere Heritage Park Trust receiving \$815 and the Malvern Lions Club over \$900.

Garden waste can normally be disposed of either through optional Council kerbside green organics bins in townships or at the Pines Resource Recovery Park near Rolleston. Garden waste can also be composted in your back yard. Information about home composting is available online at www.selwyn. govt.nz/rubbish under the 'organic collection' link. You can also recycle your scrap metal at the Pines Resource Recovery Park.

Council Solid Waste Manager Andrew Boyd says it was encouraging to see so many residents turn up and dispose of their waste in a way that will benefit the environment, it's also great to be able to support local groups through the donations received.
