

Foster Park playground is ready for the Christmas holidays!

The brand new playground will be open for Selwyn children and families from midday on Thursday 21 December.

Council Major Projects Property Manager, John Reid, says Selwyn's first 'destination playground' is opening earlier than planned thanks to Council staff and contractors' passion for the project.

"Everyone, particularly all the contractors led by local company McLenaghan Contracting, has worked extremely hard to have the playground ready for Christmas. This playground is for the whole district and we hope that it becomes a special place for families to enjoy," Mr Reid says.

"The park features are based on the ideas of local school kids – the kids wanted a mouse wheel, a big slide a fort and a flying fox, so we put those things in."

Mr Reid expects there will be a lot of interest in the opening of the playground and suggests that if possible, people wait for a day or two before visiting the park.

"We're expecting a huge number of people to visit the Foster Park playground, and we want to make sure everyone enjoys the experience – so please be mindful and respectful of others and be safe. If the playground looks too busy, we suggest that you choose another time to visit, or wait for the initial rush to subside," he says.

"There will be small areas of the playground still to be finished and we ask the public to respect and stay off the new garden and lawn areas as they develop and mature."

From Thursday 21 December to Sunday 24 December, there will be Council and community support staff at the playground to ensure all children enjoy the new playground safely.

Playground design

A key feature of the playground is a large four metre high mound with a slide and flying fox. A fort on top of the mound has a tunnel slide winding to the ground. The playground also features a natural play area and a mouse wheel along with other popular playground equipment.

The playground is designed to be as accessible as possible for all children with a promenade alongside of it, wide paths and a koru-shaped path leading to the top of the mound which allows access for disabled children to the views, large metal slide and flying fox.

A variety of surfaces including artificial turf, rubber soft fall and wood chip will make the playground a safe environment for children of all ages. Decking and picnic areas will have shade sails. There is also native and exotic trees and shrubs around the playground providing shade and a natural feel.

Let's use our Water Sense

Help Selwyn get through the dry season with enough water for everyone. Top tips for using your water sense:

Consider letting your lawns go brown, or water overnight (9pm-6am) to avoid evaporation during the day.

Avoid unnecessary water use during peak demand times (6am–9am and 4pm–9pm) to help maintain water pressure for everyone.

Use a watering can or hand-held hose instead of a sprinkler and avoid watering in hot or windy conditions.

Thank you for doing your bit to help conserve the district's water supply.

STOCK WATER RACES

Summer is here and lowering intake river levels and increased evaporation is affecting supply in certain areas.

Extraction from stock water races for uses other than stock water requires Council approval. Unauthorised extraction places pressure on the race system and often supply to downstream users is affected.

If you are experiencing poor supply in the stock water races please phone 347 2800 for service.

remember to phone 347 2720 each morning to check whether irrigation restrictions are in place.

NEED FILL MATERIAL? RING US

From early January 2018, the Council will commence cleaning water races and bank removals. Selwyn District Council appreciates landowners that are willing to accept water race spoil and material from water race bank removal. If you are happy to accept water race material, our water race operators will be in touch to arrange disposal of materials at your paddock during cleaning season.

Water race spoil can be deposited to land under **Environment Canterbury water** plan rule 5.79. Spoil can be used to fill in low spots in paddocks, and ideally will be worked into the paddock.

Get your summer recycling sorted!

Selwyn District Council is encouraging residents to help the environment and reduce the amount of waste going to landfill by making sure they dispose of holiday-season recyclables responsibly this summer.

Household recycling in Selwyn has been steadily increasing in volume from 4,982 tonnes in the year to June 2016 to 5,385 tonnes in the year to June 2017.

All recyclable items must be loose in your yellow bin so they can be easily separated for recycling. Soft plastics including newspaper wrap and cling film can't be recycled through the kerbside recycling system, only empty supermarket plastic bags are accepted.

Takeaway coffee cups have a thin plastic coating, and for this reason they can't be recycled. Drinking glasses or crockery also can't be recycled. Non-foil Christmas gift wrapping paper can be recycled rather than put into the rubbish.

Rubbish and recycling collections scheduled on Christmas Day (Monday 25th) will take place the prior Saturday 23 December. Refuse collections scheduled on New Year's Day (Monday 1 January) will take place the prior Saturday 30 December. All other collection days will proceed as normal.
