

As part of our Annual Plan we are seeking your comments on whether local libraries should be open on Sundays and for longer in the early evening to make it easier for people to use library services.

Currently, libraries are open on weekdays from 8.30am-5pm, with Lincoln and Rolleston offering late night opening on Thursdays until 7pm. Libraries are also open on Saturdays from 9.30am-12.30pm. With the current opening times, some people find it difficult to visit local libraries.

Council service centres are currently only available from 8.30am-5pm on weekdays. With changes to library opening hours proposed, extended hours for service centres at Darfield, Leeston and Lincoln are also proposed, with service centre functions available from 10am to 1pm on Saturdays (but not on Sundays). The extended hours will be trialled for 6 months and reviewed before a decision is made on whether to make the change permanent. Opening for extended hours will increase the running costs of libraries and require a \$10 rate increase per property.

On the roads this week

Road resurfacing will take place on Ayers, Woodward and Fuller Streets and Hudsons Road, with stop/go traffic controls operating at all sites. Road levelling will take place on Coleridge Road, with priority give way controls operating. Footpath reconstruction work is planned on Torlesse Crescent in Darfield.

From Monday 1 May until mid June, road widening will occur on Jones Road between Weedons Ross Road and the Lyttelton Port Company. The road will remain open, but may be reduced to one lane at times with traffic delays expected. Maddisons Road is suggested as an alternative route at peak times.

Christchurch Southern Motorway extension

From Wednesday 26 April, Waterholes Road (between 865 Waterholes Road and the intersection of Waterholes Road and Hamptons Road) will be closed to allow for some work in preparation for a motorway overbridge. The closure will be in place until late May, with detours in place.

Sections of Weedons Ross Road between State Highway One and Jones Road, and Weedons Road between State Highway One and Levi Road are closed both ways to traffic. A closure will also be in place on Weedons Road from Main South Road through to Levi Road. The closures are to allow cables to be laid as part of the Christchurch Southern Motorway extension project. Detours will be clearly sign-posted.

Selling food? New laws affects you

If you sell food – whether in a shop, online or from home – you need to know about changes to food safety laws which may affect you. Under the Food Act, you can sell food you make at home. But you need to make sure it's safe and follow the same food safety rules as other businesses – which may involve being registered and getting checked. There are some exemptions in place for registrations – for example if food is sold for fundraising or if catering occurs for a single event then registration is not required. The new rules are designed to ensure that people can have confidence that the food they buy is safe. Illness from food contamination or improper storage or cooking can make people seriously ill.

The Ministry for Primary Industries have a tool called 'Where do I fit?' (online at www.mpi.govt.nz/ where-do-i-fit) which you can use to work out whether you need to be registered when carrying out your activity. Food and Health Standards also provide a mentoring service which can provide assistance on developing a Food Control Plan, if this is required. There is a cost for this service.

Proposed rate changes

As part of our Annual Plan, we are now consulting on some key topics to help guide our activities for July 2017 to June 2018. Along with consultation on these topics and our work programme, we are also consulting on rates levels for 2017/18.

The average rate increase is 4.5%, however the changes for individual properties will vary. The main factors affecting rates are:

- · changes to the general rate
- a proposal to replace different township stormwater rates with a standard \$85 rate in areas where the Council manages stormwater
- an increase in the district water rate from \$370 to \$391 for partially metered supplies and from \$214 to \$226 for fully metered supplies
- an increase to the Arthur's Pass and Castle Hill refuse rates from \$79 to \$121, and introduction of a recycling targeted rate to reflect the new service to be provided at these locations
- increases to water race targeted rates (Ellesmere 10%, Malvern 20% and Paparua 20%) to reflect the cost of maintaining the water race network
- an increase to the Library Rate to fund a trial of longer opening hours
- some increases to reserve and community centre targeted rates, with bigger increases for Tai Tapu and West Melton to help pay for new community facilities.

Visit a Magical Park

Rolleston Reserve is coming to life with animated dinosaurs, kittens and alien invaders these school holidays. The reserve is the first park in Selwyn to become a 'Magical Park' where children are guided by an app that allows them to herd cats, see dinosaurs brought back to life, and witness what an alien invasion is like.

"The app involves children in a number of fun tasks at parks including finding dinosaur eggs, and herding kittens which provides a great workout," says Selwyn District Council Senior Events and Recreation Advisor Dave Tippett.

"The app combines technology and physical activity in a free engaging activity for families to try out over the school holidays."

The 'Magical Park' app is designed for kids aged 6-11. It can be downloaded from Google Play or the ITunes App Store for free. It is compatible with iPhone 5+, iPad 3+, or android devices with a compass, gyroscope, accelerometer and GPS.

The average playing time for kids using the app is 30-60 minutes and in this time kids typically cover between 700 metres and 2 kilometers.

"Magical Park is being trialed at Rolleston Reserve and if it proves popular we will look at introducing it at some other parks across Selwyn," says Mr Tippett.

Signage is installed at Rolleston Reserve (by the skate area) with information on how to participate in Magical Park.
