

Izone Success Recognised



The contribution of Izone to Selwyn's economy has been recognised with a nomination for a national excellence award.

The development of the Izone Southern Business Hub is a finalist in the Local Government New Zealand (LGNZ) EXCELLENCE Awards. The project was nominated in the Crown Fibre Holdings EXCELLENCE Award for Best Practice Contribution to Local Economic Development.

Izone is New Zealand's largest fully consented and development-ready industrial park. It covers 188 hectares, with only 9.6 hectares of council land remaining unsold. Currently more than 70 businesses employ 1,260 people with a further 800 jobs forecast to be created when the park is fully developed. The ports of Tauranga and Lyttelton have inland ports within or nearby Izone.

Planning for the site goes back to 2000 when the Council saw the need for land to attract businesses to Rolleston and purchased a 130 hectare area of land for the project.

"Those that began the project can be very proud of the impact that Izone has had, and will continue to have, on our district and the families who live here," says Mayor Sam Broughton.

On the roads this week

The intersection of Hoskyns and Sandy Knolls Roads is being upgraded and a change of priority will occur in July so that traffic approaching from Sandy Knolls Road will need to stop. Traffic delays may occur and detours may operate while the upgrade occurs. Sewer line installation work is continuing on Shands and Selwyn Roads – traffic delays may occur due to this work.

Levelling works are planned on Ellesmere, Southbridge Leeston and Rakaia Selwyn Roads. Cattlestop cleaning is planned on Lyndon and Harper Roads. Stop/go traffic controls will operate at all sites. Road works are planned on Algidus and South Two Chain Roads with traffic controls operating. Bridge replacement continues on Jarvis Road with the road closed. A turning bay is being created at the intersection of Dynes and Springston Rolleston Road, with traffic controls in place at this location.

SeatSmart recycling creates safer journeys

A new local car seat recycling programme is helping remove unsafe child car seats from use and recycling the seat parts.

The Council partnered with SeatSmart in March to carry out a local trial which offered parents the chance to have old car seats recycled at a heavily subsidised rate. The trial was due to finish at the end of June but due to its success the programme will continue to operate in Selwyn. 49 car seats have been dropped off at the Pines Resource Recovery Park since the programme started.

With the programme continuing, Selwyn parents can take their unwanted car seats to the Pines Resource Recovery Park to have them recycled for a \$5 charge (normally \$10).

The seats are dismantled through Department of Corrections community work programmes. The recovered plastic is recycled into products for the building industry, metal parts are taken to metal recyclers, and the harnesses will be used by Karkt NZ and The Green Collective who make handmade bags.

Selwyn School Road Safety Coordinator Stephanie Hautler says all car seats have an expiry date on them and over time seats can be damaged from UV light, heat, general wear and tear or in a crash. You can find information about how to check their seat's expiry date at www.seatmart.co.nz. Locally, the Council has trained a number of volunteers as child restraint technicians and they can check car seat safety and install seats for free – see 'Selwyn Car Seat Champions' on Facebook for details.

Booster and convertible seats can be recycled through the recycling programme, along with capsules, but polystyrene seats are not part of the programme.

The Pines Resource Recovery Park is located at 183 Burnham School Road and is open Monday to Fridays, 9am-4.30pm, and from 10am-4pm on Saturdays and Sundays.

Cross-council work recognised nationally

Selwyn District Council has been recognised as part of a multi-council building innovation group spanning the Canterbury region.

The Greater Canterbury Cluster – also comprising Christchurch City Council and Ashburton, Kaikoura, Hurunui and Waimakariri District Councils – is the Building Officials Institute of New Zealand Carter Holt Harvey Building Control Innovator of the year 2017 which celebrates commitment to innovation in engineering.

Selwyn District Council Environmental Services Manager Tim Harris says the Council is very proud to be part of a region-wide initiative which is working toward collective benchmarks for Council building control authority customer service.

"The cluster's aim is to improve collective business processes through common documentation, increasing the ability for software to exchange and make use of building consent information sharing across Canterbury.

"This joint understanding of the systems enables opportunities for improvement, and enhances the consistency of customer experience across the region," says Tim.

The Greater Canterbury Cluster was established in 2016, in a collaboration with the Ministry for Business Innovation and Employment to drive a dramatic change in council building control authority customer service. The cluster has explored how each council controls building consenting, building inspections, build completion, staff resources and consenting fees.

New fire service to start operating

From 1 July 2017 Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) - a new national organisation combining urban and rural fire services will start operating. Selwyn District Council and other local councils will no longer be responsible for issuing fire permits or responding to rural fires from 1 July onwards.

Local volunteer fire brigades will continue to respond to fires but they will now be part of the new FENZ organisation. If you need to report a fire under the new system you will still call 111, the same as now.

If you need to apply for a fire permit you can email firepermit.enquiry@fireandemergency.nz or phone 0800 658 628. You can also check the fire status in Selwyn by visiting www.checkitsalright.nz. One function that will continue to be carried out by the Council until 1 July 2018 will be investigating complaints about vegetation which creates a fire risk. If you need to report this as an issue you can phone the Council on 347 2800 or 318 8338.

DOG REGISTRATION STARTS IN JULY

It's that time of year again when all dog owners must ensure that their dogs are registered. All dogs older than 3 months must be registered every year (July-June) under the Dog Control Act 1996. It's a \$300 fine for an unregistered dog. A re-registration notice will arrive in your inbox or letterbox by 1 July. *Registration Fee (Inclusive of GST)* The 2017-18 fee falls due on 1 July 2017 and may be paid throughout the month of July. This may be done via a payment link when the form is emailed, internet banking, at our Rolleston Headquarters or service centres in Leeston, Darfield or Lincoln. Alternatively, you may use the prepaid return envelope provided with your registration form.

If paid by **31 July 2017**, the discounted registration fee applicable is:

- A \$10 administration/owner fee
- \$30 for each dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

For payments after 31 July 2017 the full registration fee

applicable is:

- A \$15 administration/owner fee
- \$40 for each dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

If you have changed your email address or postal address since last year's registration, please email animalcontrol@selwyn.govt.nz so that your details can be confirmed.

Tag and Collar Fees (Inclusive of GST)

The fee for a replacement dog tag is \$5 and for a dog collar \$9-\$11 depending on the size.

These fees and charges are set under Sections 37, 38 and 68 of the Dog Control Act 1996.

DISRUPTION TO MALVERN WATER RACE SERVICE

Selwyn District Council is starting construction of a new fish screen facility at the Waimakariri Gorge Water Race intake, and Glentunnel Water Race intake as required by Environment Canterbury consent conditions.

During the construction period, mid-June to August, the water race supply in the Malvern scheme may be disrupted. The Waimakariri Gorge Intake race may need to be shut down for construction. The Kowai intake will be used to continue to provide supply. Disruption to water race users will be minimised where possible.
