Helping children get to school safely

The Council's new School Road Safety Coordinator Stephanie Hautler has had a busy start to her role and has been working with a number of local schools on safety initiatives.

Stephanie has visited all Selwyn primary schools to provide them with information on bike and scooter safety information they can display around the school and include in their newsletters.

Together with Constable Rick Groen, School Community Officer she has visited Lemonwood Grove and West Rolleston Schools. Both schools have new kea crossings operating which are supervised by parents and staff. Stephanie and Constable Rick helped with training and operating the patrols when they started. Lemonwood Grove School also received a donation of safety vests from the Selwyn Women's Issues group for every student. Stephanie also joined Rolleston Primary School for the training of their new Road Patrol team.

Greendale School recently received a visit from Constable Rick and Stephanie for bus monitor training for senior students and bus safety training for the whole school. Pupils have high visibility safety vests to wear which helps them be seen by motorists when getting on and off the bus and while they are on roadsides.

Stephanie is also planning to work with West Rolleston School to develop a school travel plan covering safe walking, cycling and scootering options as well as travel by car.

"It's a good idea for parents to walk, scoot or bike with their children where possible to teach them about road safety and how to safely cross roads. High visibility vests are also a good idea and they should wear a helmet if biking or scootering," she says. Around schools parents and other motorists also need to slow down and watch out for children before and after school.



Dealing with a barking dog

Having a barking dog in your street can be annoying for both neighbours and dog owners.

It's a common nuisance, but often it can be successfully resolved, allowing you to enjoy some peace and quiet. The Council's Animal Control team often deals with barking complaints and has a number of tips on how to resolve them.

"Barking can have a variety of causes," says Animal Control Team Leader Steve Clarke. "Boredom, anxiety, loneliness, lack of exercise, fleas, hunger or a change in home or environment are common reasons why barking occurs."

Steve recommends trying to work out what is causing the barking and trying different things to remedy it. For example if you think your dog may be bored try leaving them with toys to entertain them. If you think they may be lonely have someone visit them or drop them off to a friend or family member so they have some company. For more advice visit www.selwyn.govt.nz/barking

If the barking doesn't improve you can try contacting a dog behaviourist, enrolling your dog in training or contacting the Council's Animal Control team on 347 2910 for advice.

If a barking dog nearby is bothering you, try speaking to the owner initially. "Often issues only occur when no one is home at the property so the owner isn't aware of the problem," says Steve.

If the problem doesn't improve after speaking with the owner then you can call the Council's Animal Control team on 347 2910 to report a problem. It is helpful to keep a record of when the barking has occurred as this can help identify what is triggering it.

On the roads this week

Preseal road repairs are planned on Southbridge Dunsandel, Rakaia Selwyn and Leaches Roads. Road repairs are also planned on Minchins and Leaches Roads. Traffic controls will operate at all sites.

Road resurfacing is planned on North Terrace and Coaltrack Road, with stop/go controls operating. Footpath repairs are planned on Matanui Street in Lincoln. New footpath construction is continuing in Rolleston on Brookside Road and Overbury Crescent.

Work is continuing on the Masefield Drive upgrade and footpath construction. Temporary traffic management is in place – please drive carefully. Manse Road roading and stormwater improvement work continues.

Road reconstruction continues on Gerald Street.

Rail/road closures

From Saturday 11 March until Wednesday 15 March the Dawsons Road rail crossing will be closed to allow Kiwirail to complete a crossing upgrade. Detours will be sign posted.

Dynes Road is currently closed to traffic from the intersection with Springston Rolleston Road to about 150 metres from this intersection. The closure is to extend a sewer main along the road and will be in place until around 20 March (the reopening date has now been brought forward).

From Monday 13 March until 10 April Stoneleigh Drive will be closed. A new roundabout is being installed at the intersection of Hoskyns Road and Stoneleigh Drive. The closure is a safety measure to reduce traffic build up on Hoskyns Road. Hoskyns Road will remain open with traffic controls operating.

Christchurch Southern Motorway extension

The passing lane on Main South Road between Rolleston and Weedons Road is closed for works related to the Christchurch Southern Motorway Stage 2.

On Weedons Road there is currently no access to Main South Road from Levi Road with a one way system in place.
