

Plans to develop a new skate facility for Lincoln have moved forward, with a location for the site being confirmed and a concept plan now available to view.

The skate facility is planned outside Lincoln Event Centre at the front of the facility near the existing play area. This location provides good visibility of the skate area, helping to improve safety. The design includes a shallow bowl, a deeper big bowl, flat skating areas and ramp. The design is aimed at providing spaces for both advanced, intermediate and beginner skateboarders as well as children on scooters.

Local schools will also be part of the consultation process. The Council has budgeted for construction to occur this autumn and winter.

A new skate park is also planned for West Melton next year.

Busy year ahead for Motorway project

The Christchurch Southern Motorway Stage 2 (CSM2) team are geared up for a busy year, as work ramps up across this NZ Transport Agency project.

Work has started on sealing a new local road ('Manion Road' – built between Weedons Ross Road and Curraghs Road), drainage and temporary road construction next to Waterholes Road and piping the new stockwater race along Weedons Road in preparation for the new Weedons Road Interchange to be constructed. Construction of various new internal driveways are coming along well as the team works towards the opening of Manion Road in April 2017 which will allow the closure of accesses onto Main South Road. Power and telecommunications cable trenching is also occurring along the project together with vegetation clearance. There will be changes to traffic management arrangements across the project to allow the construction team to safely carry out its work. Please remember that traffic management controls (signs, cones, barriers and fences) are in place to keep you safe.

The lizard capture programme along with the salvage and relocation of aquatic wildlife living within water races continues across the project.

Over the next eight months, you will notice:

- · the closure of a section of Trents Road for one year with a detour in place via nearby roads
- · construction starting on temporary roads at Halswell Junction Road, Shands Road, Springs Road and at the intersection of Waterholes/Hamptons Road.
- \cdot bridge construction commencing on Main South Road, Waterholes Road, Trents Road and at the Weedons Road interchange.

The four laning of Main South Road sees work zones currently active from Rolleston to Weedons Ross Road. From mid-2017 the crews will continue work from Weedons Ross Road heading towards Curraghs Road.

Explore Selwyn: Coalgate to Glentunnel

The newly developed Glentunnel to Coalgate walkway/cycleway connects these two small, rural townships which lie near the

The path between the townships is two kilometres long and is flat. It's an easy bike ride or walk for the whole family which is suitable for buggies, young cyclists or wheelchairs.

The walkway passes over a new bridge over a large drain near Coaltrack Road underneath which lies historic brick arch and cobble culvert.

At Glentunnel you can grab an ice cream at the local dairy or take a tour of the historic buildings dotted through the township, such as the library or the chapel. Glentunnel has a historical association with local coalmines, potteries and brickworks of the Glentunnel/South Malvern area. Many of the miners' cottages are still lived in today.

On the roads this week

Preseal road repairs are planned on Leaches Road, with road repairs also planned at Dalethorpe and Minchins Roads, with stop/go traffic controls operating at all sites.

Road resurfacing is planned on Coaltrack, Telegraph and Hororata Roads, with stop/go controls operating. Footpath construction continues on Brookside Road and Overbury Crescent in Rolleston, with footpath repairs planned on Douglas Street in Lincoln.

Work is continuing on the Masefield Drive upgrade and footpath construction. Manse Road roading and stormwater improvement work continues. Road reconstruction continues on Gerald Street. Temporary traffic management is in place at these sites.

Rail/road closures

From Saturday 18 March until Wednesday 22 March, the Weedons Ross Road level crossing will be closed to allow KiwiRail to complete a crossing upgrade, with detours sign posted.

Dynes Road is currently closed to traffic from the intersection with Springston Rolleston Road to about 150 metres from this intersection. The closure is to extend a sewer main along the road and will be in place until around 20 March.

Stoneleigh Drive will be closed until mid-April. A new roundabout is being installed at the intersection of Hoskyns Road and Stoneleigh Drive. The closure is a safety measure to reduce traffic build up on Hoskyns Road. Hoskyns Road will remain open with traffic controls operating.

Christchurch Southern Motorway extension

On Weedons Road there is currently no access to Main South Road from Levi Road with a one way system in place.

RESTRICTED FIRE SEASON

A prohibited fire season (total fire ban) was in place across the district, but following recent rain the fire status has been altered to move to a restricted fire season in the rural areas of Selwyn district, as from 8am Monday 13 March 2017 until further notice.

In a restricted fire season, only gas barbeques, crop residue and rubbish fires inside contained drums, and fires which have received a written permit from Selwyn District Council are allowed in rural areas of Selwyn. Vegetation fires to burn trees or other items are not allowed unless permitted. There are a number of conditions which must be met before fires can be lit - these are available online at www.selwyn.

In residential areas the only type of fire permitted throughout the year are barbeques or cooking fires. Other fires need a resource consent from Environment Canterbury.
