Watch out, snow could be about



The cold breeze of winter is now enveloping Selwyn and this brings the risk of snow.

Snow is common in the district during winter and has the potential to cut off power and telephone services and close roads. Selwyn District Council Emergency Management Officer Ryan O'Rourke says now that winter is here, it is important for people to ensure their household is well prepared to cope with snow. "The further away from a main town you live, the better your preparations need to be as you could be housebound for several days until roads can be cleared and power restored."

However a large snowstorm could cut power to main towns like Rolleston, Lincoln and the surrounding areas so everyone needs to be ready to cope with that situation. To prepare your household for snow you can take the following steps:

- · Have several days' food and bottled water, medication and a first aid kit, a portable battery operated radio, torch and baby food
- · Have an alternative power source and another way of cooking food if the power fails
- · If possible look to keep your cars fuel levels up
- · On the farm; plan where livestock can be moved to shelter and ensure there is enough dry feed
- · Consider how you would supply stock water if the power is off. Most animal deaths in winter storms are from dehydration
- \cdot Register online to join Selwyn Gets Ready at www.selwyn.getsready.net. This free service will send you severe weather warnings and emails or texts with updates in an emergency

If a snow storm hits then:

- · Listen to your radio, or television, and visit the Council website, www.selwyn.govt.nz or the Selwyn District Council Facebook page for information
- · Ensure you drink enough water and watch for signs of frostbite or hypothermia. Wear layers of loose, light, warm clothing
- \cdot Keep rooms well ventilated when using gas or kerosene heaters to avoid toxic fumes building up
- \cdot Bring pets inside and move stock to shelter
- · Report broken utility lines to Orion
- \cdot Check on your neighbours and help them out if needed
- · Avoid driving unless absolutely necessary. If you have to travel take snow chains, warm clothing and essential emergency items in case you become stuck
- · If you are caught in your vehicle in a snowstorm, stay where you are and make yourself visible by tying a bright-coloured cloth to your radio aerial and keep the inside light on.

On the roads this week

Seal repairs are occurring on Telegraph Road, please stop on request. Maintenance metalling is occurring on Knyvetts Road. Footpath repairs will take place in Arthur's Pass and Darfield. Bridge maintenance work will be taking place on old Tai Tapu Road and Mt White Road.

Intersection upgrade is continuing at Masefield Drive/Rolleston Drive with the pavement construction, asphalting and surfacing and line-marking completed over

the weekend. Traffic lights are being turned on this week. Drivers to take care at the new layout.

Night closures along Hoskyns Road started last week at the Jones Road/Hoskyns Road intersection upgrade, as crews work to complete the final asphalt surfacing of the intersection and the line marking. The traffic lights will then be installed over the next week.

You can dispose of the ash from your fireplace in your red lid rubbish bin, but it's important you do so safely to avoid the chance of a fire starting in your bin or in the collection trucks.

Here are some handy tips on how to dispose of ash safely:

- · Put ash in a metal bucket with a lid, then douse with water and leave to cool for at least five days
- · Bag cold ash and place it in the red lid rubbish bin
- · Don't put ash in the organics bins

Hot ash can cause fires in trucks, bins and can spread from bins to houses.
