Kids getting active this autumn



Over 4000 young people from 10 Selwyn schools will be getting active on their way to school for the second annual 'Active Autumn'.

Council's Road Safety team are running the campaign in term two to encourage children at 10 schools to use an active mode of transport such as walking, skating, biking or scootering to get to and from school.

Schools are provided with Active Autumn packs to educate families about active transport. While children can take part in the W.o.W challenge, where they get a card stamped each time they walk or wheel to or from school.

A colouring competition is also being held, with children challenged to develop their own road safety message.

School Road Safety Coordinator Stephanie Hautler says there are physical and mental benefits for children from active transport including better road safety awareness, independence, friendships and physical fitness.

"Skipping the car ride also means less noise, less congestion, less visual pollution and cleaner air. Burning less fuel saves money too," Ms Hautler says.

Active travel can be a challenge to fit into an already busy day. Below are some ideas that you may be able to utilise to get your child active:

- · Park and stride drop your child a short distance from school instead of at the gate. Scout out a location where they can safely walk without crossing any major roads or entranceways. Make this your meeting point after school too.
- · Pick a route and get to know it find a walking route that minimises the number of roads to be crossed and avoids busy intersections, and get to know it together. Point out hazards such as blind corners and discuss where to cross.
- · Find some buddies you may be able to take turns with other parents escorting a small group to school. Better yet, organise a walking school bus or scooter train. Talk to your school about how to set up a walking school bus.

Rolleston town centre upgrades – roading layout changes proposed

We're seeking feedback on proposed changes to the roading layout of Tennyson and Wordsworth Streets, which are planned as part of the Rolleston town centre upgrade project.

The proposed roading designs for the Tennyson Street upgrades and the Wordsworth Street extension are now available for the public to view. For more information and to complete a feedback form go to selwyn.govt.nz/rtc-design.

Tennyson Street upgrades overview

It's proposed that Tennyson Street has a 30km/h speed limit with 3.2m-wide traffic lanes, regular kerb extensions and raised platforms. This design creates a safe environment for cyclists when sharing the road with motor vehicles.

Some key design features include:

- capacity for forecast peak hour traffic volume of 500 to 600 vehicles per hour
- footpaths on each side of the road are wide while still providing space for traffic lanes and parking. The paths on each side of the street can also be used by cyclists (cycle lanes have not been proposed).

Wordsworth Street extension overview

A pedestrian-friendly, slow speed environment is also proposed in Wordsworth Street, which will be extended through to Tennyson Street as part of the town centre project.

The configuration of the road has been designed to encourage slow vehicle speeds and incorporates a narrow carriageway and raised platforms at the primary pedestrian crossing points. The existing cul-de-sac turning head will be removed because the road will ultimately connect to the town centre. The street cross-section provides space to accommodate two-way vehicle movement and on-street parking. As with Tennyson Street, the design provides footpaths that are a minimum of 3.5m wide.

The proposed configuration for the southern section of Wordsworth Street has a 6m wide road with kerb and channel, a 1.8m wide footpath on one side of the road and 2.5m wide shared path on the reserve side of the road.

Some key design features include:

- · designated space for vehicles, while pedestrians and cyclists will be free to travel anywhere
- 33 parking spaces for users of the tennis courts, reserve and Scout den along the road in a mix of parallel parking bays and right-angle bays
- separate off-road car park with 12 spaces near the Playcentre.





On the roads this week

Repairs will be carried out on Selwyn Road and Ridge Road until Friday 3 May. Traffic management will be in place during this time.

Road works will be continuing on Goulds Road between Maltby Drive and East Maddisons Road until Friday 17 May. Detours and traffic management will be in place during this time.

Footpath construction will be occurring on Edward Street from Millstream Drive to Southfield Drive, Tod Place and North Belt from James Street to Kildare Terrace until Friday 3 May.

Al Lawn, who took over as the council's Civil Defence Manager in April, says he's aiming to build on the work done by the team recent years under former manager Ryan O'Rourke, former Emergency Management Officer Tasha Black and current team members Sue Jenkins and Jason Flewellen.

"They have helped to create a Civil Defence team that is the envy of many in New Zealand. They have done a brilliant job so I'm just following on their coat tails."

A former policeman and volunteer firefighter Mr Lawn has worked extensively for Civil Defence in the past five years including as the district's Civil Defence Controller and as Recovery Manager after the Port Hills Fire. He spent three weeks assisting with the management of the Civil Defence response to the Kaikōura earthquakes and 10 months as a response manager in the northern South Island overseeing the Ministry of Primary Industries response to the Mycoplasma bovis outbreak.

Having farmed near Lincoln for the past 20 years and serving as a District Licensing Commissioner for five years he says he enjoys living and working in the district.

His work includes ensuring the district is as resilient and prepared, as best it can be, to respond to any adverse event.

That includes making sure resources are in place to enable communities to respond through their Community Response Teams and the district's Response/Rescue Team.
