

A blessing ceremony led by Te Taumutu Rūnanga has prepared the way for work to begin on the new Rolleston Town Centre.

The ceremony blessed the ground for construction of Te Ara Ātea, the new library, community and cultural facility, which will be the first stage in the town centre development.

The Council has appointed Armitage Williams Construction Limited as the contractor to build Te Ara Ātea and Isaac Construction to carry out the transport and infrastructure work for the town centre, starting with work on Tennyson Street.

The work is expected to begin in November and Te Ara Ātea is expected to be completed in early 2021.

Mayor Sam Broughton says the projects are an exciting step for the town and the district. Te Ara \bar{A} tea—a name gifted by Te Taumutu R \bar{u} nanga which means "the unobstructed trail to the world and beyond"—is the perfect project to begin the work, he says.

"Te Ara Ātea will be the heart of the new town centre that will take us into the future, creating a hub that will meet our growing needs and bring communities together.

"It's appropriate we start with a place designed for all generations to gather, learn and discover. It's been good to partner with Te Taumutu and it's also fitting to start with a project connected with mana whenua that celebrates our history and looks to the future."

The town centre will also feature a town square, recreational space, commercial, retail and hospitality developments.

The roading upgrades will create a low-speed, cycle and pedestrian-friendly streetscape with on and off-street car parking.

First ever Selwyn Arts Festival set to launch

An extravaganza of art will be celebrated and created during the inaugural Selwyn Arts Festival.

The arts festival, which runs from 11–20 October, will feature demonstrations, workshops, a live art competition and a guided gallery tour.

District Arts coordinator Becca Bouffandeau says the festival will give people a chance to see a different perspective on art in the district.

"Selwyn has a lot of great art and artists, but often we don't know them, they're just a signature in the corner of a painting. The festival will give people a chance to meet the artists, see them work or make something fun themselves."

Opportunities to get up close and personal will begin with a wearable arts show featuring local and national talent on 12 October and an Art Crawl the next day visiting Selwyn's three art galleries.

The tour offers visitors a chance to meet artists and gallery managers and even be the subject of their own work of art by portrait artist Sam Wakelin.

Mr Wakelin will be drawing free portraits for visitors to the Lakeland Gallery from 10.30am–3.30pm.

There will be a wide array of workshops throughout the festival from carving, weaving, fashion and photography to an opportunity to create with no rules.

The festival will build on Darfield Artweek which will run throughout the festival, showcasing more than 300 mixed media artworks from 120 New Zealand artists at the Darfield Recreation Centre.

Hub days to support local living

New clubs and community group days will offer people a chance to strengthen their local ties and support a great life in Selwyn.

Three local living hubs, coordinated by the Council, will see community groups and clubs showcase what they offer, and give people a chance to get to know others with similar interests in their area, Council Community Services staff member Sammy Lawson says.

"It's a great chance to help people connect and make sure they're aware of everything that's on offer. Clubs and community groups offer people a chance to grow their passions, participate in the community and get to know others."

The first hub will be held at the Dunsandel Community Centre on Saturday 12 October from 2–4pm. Between 10–14 local sports, health and community groups will attend, joined by the Selwyn Parenting Network, Babies CanPlay and Plunket. Two child development experts from Babies CanPlay will be available at all three hubs to answer any child development questions.

It will be followed by hubs on Saturday 2 November at Darfield Library, 9am–12pm and Leeston Library, 1.30–4pm.

A local living hub will be held next year in Rolleston.

Traffic and parking and stock droving – have your say

The Council is consulting on proposed changes to the Traffic and Parking bylaw and the Stock Droving Bylaw.

The Traffic and Parking Bylaw is an update of the 2009 bylaw. Proposed changes include allowing residents' only parking to be created in case of need, adding electronic scooters to the bylaw and clarifying the wording for the existing ban on parking cars with 'for sale' signs.

The Stock Droving Bylaw is an update to the 2008 bylaw. Proposed changes including clarifying the rules around temporary fencing, responsibility for stock in case of an accident or animals found wandering and building an underpass. It would also require stock drovers to wear high-visibility vests.

Faces of Selwyn - Crafting a dream through brewing

At 8.30 on a Sunday morning Gabi Michael is tucked away in her home brewery trying to brew the perfect beer.

Gabi, from Campo Grande, Brazil, is the sales and marketing manager at Gladfield Malt. She trained as a vet while working on her father's farm and moved to New Zealand in 2003.

"I wanted to do something different. I was sort of struggling there with my dad. He was kind of a conservative man. He had other plans for me, and I had other plans for myself.'

Just two months later she met her husband Doug, who she describes as a typical Kiwi farmer and a

"We looked at each other and kind of, you know, 'He's alright, she's alright'," she laughs. "I stayed over and never looked back; got married one year after."

They created Gladfield Malt on their Dunsandel farm and export malt to brewers all over the world.

When her three children were young Gabi took an administrative role, but as they grew up she wanted to do more for the business and also took up brewing.

"It becomes kind of a drug because you want to make the best beer ever brewed. You're always trying to outdo yourself. It's contagious. It's like doing meditation because you're very focused on that task."

Her Brazilian heritage also has a part to play.

"I like the lagers. Because I'm from Brazil I grew up drinking lagers. The minute I can drink a quenching lager that I brew, I'm quite proud of it."
