Cr Murray Lemon, Chair of the Selwyn Community Fund Committee was involved in allocating the fund for round one.


"There was a diverse range of applications for funding reflecting the range of organisations operating in the greater Selwyn district all helping to make Selwyn a great place to live, work and play," he says.

# Fire restrictions in place





Anyone wanting to light a fire outside in the Selwyn district will need to obtain a permit from Fire and Emergency.

Gas or charcoal barbecues can still be used without a permit.

"We normally have to put fire restrictions in place at the start of the summer, but the unusually wet spring meant that at the start of this summer the fire risk was very low so there was no need for restrictions," says Fire and Emergency Principal Rural Fire Officer Bruce Janes.

"However, the recent run of warm weather has dried out all the vegetation growth caused by the unusual weather patterns and we have a very large fuel load that could potentially cause a fire to spread very quickly.

"With the fire risk indices moving steadily upwards, it is time to introduce restrictions," Mr Janes says.

# Lakeside Soldiers Memorial Hall opening



Lakeside Soldiers Memorial Hall was officially opened on Friday 1 February, where over 140 people from Lakeside and the wider Selwyn district attended. Mayor Sam Broughton, Hon Amy Adams, Council staff and members of the Lakeside Community Memorial Hall Committee were also in attendance.

A representative from Te Taumutu Rūnanga performed a blessing and a local Anglican minister provided a blessing and a prayer. Construction of the \$1.67 million facility began in April 2017 and was completed in November 2018. The new facility has replaced the original earthquake-damaged hall, which was demolished several years ago, with a modern, flexible community space and special events venue.

## New park-and-ride for Rolleston

Residents who have gone past the Council's Rolleston headquarters recently will have noticed work being undertaken on the construction of a new car park and public park-and-ride facility, on the corner of Norman Kirk Drive and Kidman Street. This work is part of the extension of the Council car park and both car parks are expected to be completed in May, depending on the weather.

Council Chief Executive David Ward says the work was set in the 2018–2028 Long-Term Plan last year, as part of the extension and reconfiguration of the Council building.

"This is an exciting time for the Council and the district, as these works are a clear indication of how quickly Selwyn is developing," Mr Ward says.

The new public park-and-ride car park will provide 79 public car spaces and six cycle racks. This will allow people to park close to local bus stops in Kidman Street. It will also extend the parking capacity for Council staff with 59 additional car spaces and six motorcycle spaces. The additional car parks will provide extra parking for residents and visitors which will ease demand.

During construction, there will be some minor traffic disruptions along Norman Kirk Drive, however there will be temporary traffic management in place.

Closer to this time, we will provide more public information about temporary traffic management via Council Call, the Council's website and Facebook page.

## Water sense – recommended water use

We're encouraging households on Council water supplies to avoid watering lawns and gardens

These are the times when households use the most water, especially during weekends. If everyone waters their lawns at the same time over summer it places huge demands on water supplies.

The best time to water your lawn is between 9pm-6am, as this is when the least evaporation occurs and water has the best opportunity to soak into the ground.

If you are considering watering your lawn during the day between 9am-4pm, check the weather conditions first. Watering during the daytime is fine on cooler overcast or wet days. Watering during the middle of the day on hot or nor'west days is not a good idea as a significant amount of water will evaporate.

Although there are no formal water restrictions in place at present, we're continuing to review water use throughout summer. If demand for water increases, formal water restrictions may be introduced.
